A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ETHICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state ethics
- 2 commission was inadvertently left off of the list of state
- 3 agencies specifically authorized by statute to hire its own
- 4 attorneys.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to memorialize the long-standing
- 6 practice of having the state ethics commission employ attorneys.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 28-8.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 10 "(a) No department of the State other than the attorney
- 11 general may employ or retain any attorney, by contract or
- 12 otherwise, for the purpose of representing the State or the
- 13 department in any litigation, rendering legal counsel to the
- 14 department, or drafting legal documents for the department;
- 15 provided that the foregoing provision shall not apply to the
- 16 employment or retention of attorneys:

Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 21
