A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 138, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$138- Prepaid wireless E911 surcharge. (a) A prepaid
- 5 wireless E911 surcharge of 1.5 per cent shall be imposed on the
- 6 amount of prepaid wireless telecommunications service purchased.
- 7 The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge is the liability of the
- 8 consumer and not of the seller or provider.
- 9 (b) The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge shall be collected
- 10 by the seller from the consumer with respect to each retail
- 11 transaction occurring within the State. The amount of the
- 12 prepaid wireless E911 surcharge shall be separately listed on an
- 13 invoice, receipt, or other similar document that is provided to
- 14 the consumer by the seller.
- (c) A retail transaction occurring within the state that
- 16 is transacted in person by a consumer at a seller's business
- 17 location shall be treated as occurring within the State if the
- 18 business location is within the State. A transaction shall also



- 1 be treated as occurring within the State if the tangible
- 2 personal property is shipped and the consumer's shipping address
- 3 is within the State or, if there is no shipment, if the
- 4 consumer's billing address is within the State. If no tangible
- 5 personal property is shipped and the consumer's billing address
- 6 is not known, the transaction shall be treated as occurring
- 7 within the State if the consumer's prepaid wireless device is
- 8 associated with an address within the State.
- 9 (d) A seller may deduct and retain three per cent of
- 10 prepaid wireless E911 surcharges collected from consumers for
- 11 administrative purposes.
- (e) The seller shall remit monthly, quarterly, or semi-
- 13 annually on a calendar year basis to the board the balance of
- 14 prepaid wireless E911 surcharges collected from consumers not
- 15 later than the twentieth day after the end of the filing period.
- 16 The frequency of filing shall be determined as follows:
- 17 (1) If the seller will collect more than \$4,000 in prepaid
- wireless E911 surcharge during the year, the seller
- shall file monthly;
- 20 (2) If the seller will collect \$4,000 or less during the
- 21 year, the seller may file quarterly; and

1	(3) If the seller will collect \$2,000 or less during the		
2	year, the seller may file semi-annually.		
3	(f) The board may require sellers to remit electronically		
4	the balance of the surcharges collected and shall establish		
5	registration and payment procedures.		
6	(g) The amount of the prepaid wireless E911 surcharge that		
7	is collected by a seller from a consumer shall not be included		
8	in the base for measuring any tax, fee, surcharge, or other		
9	charge that is imposed by the State, any political subdivision		
10	of the State, or any governmental agency.		
11	(h) If a minimal amount of prepaid wireless		
12	telecommunications service is sold with a prepaid wireless		
13	device for a single, non-itemized price, the seller shall not		
14	apply the surcharge imposed in subsection (a) to the		
15	transaction. For purposes of this subsection, a "minimal		
16	amount" means service of ten minutes or less or \$5 or less.		
17	(i) The board shall establish procedures by which a seller		
18	of prepaid wireless telecommunications service may document that		
19	a sale is not a retail transaction occurring within the state.		
20	(j) Section 138-9 shall apply to providers and sellers.		

1 (k) No provider or seller shall be liable for damages to 2 any person resulting from or incurred in connection with the 3 provision of any lawful assistance to any investigative or law 4 enforcement officer of the United States or any political 5 subdivision, in connection with any lawful investigation or 6 other law enforcement activity by such law enforcement officer. 7 (1) The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge imposed by this 8 section shall be the only funding obligation imposed on prepaid 9 wireless telecommunications service in the State for enhanced 10 911 services. No other tax, fee, surcharge, or other charge for 11 enhanced 911 services shall be imposed by the State, any 12 political subdivision of the State, or any governmental agency, upon any provider, seller, or consumer with respect to the sale, 13 14 purchase, use, or provision of prepaid wireless 15 telecommunications service." 16 SECTION 2. Section 138-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended by adding seven new definitions to be appropriately 18 inserted and to read as follows:

""Consumer" means a person or entity who purchases

commercial mobile radio service or prepaid wireless

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- 1 telecommunications service in a retail transaction occurring
- 2 within the State.
- 3 "Prepaid wireless E911 surcharge" means the surcharge that
- 4 is required to be collected by a seller from a consumer in the
- 5 amount established under section 138- .
- 6 "Prepaid wireless telecommunications service" means a
- 7 wireless telecommunications service that is sold in
- 8 predetermined (minutes usage or period of time) units or dollars
- 9 that decline with use in a known amount and allows a caller to
- 10 dial 911 to access the 911 system, a service that shall be paid
- 11 for in advance.
- "Provider" means a person or entity that provides
- 13 commercial mobile radio service or prepaid wireless
- 14 telecommunications service pursuant to a license issued by the
- 15 Federal Communications Commission.
- 16 "Retail transaction" means the purchase of commercial
- 17 mobile radio service or prepaid wireless telecommunications
- 18 service from a seller for any purpose other than resale.
- 19 "Seller" means a person or entity who sells commercial
- 20 mobile radio service or prepaid wireless telecommunications
- 21 service to another person.



1 "Wireless telecommunications service" means commercial 2 mobile radio service as defined by title 47 Code of Federal 3 Regulations section 20.3." SECTION 3. Section 138-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended to read as follows: 6 "\$138-3 Enhanced 911 fund. There is established outside 7 the state treasury a special fund, to be known as the enhanced 8 911 fund, to be administered by the board. The fund shall 9 consist of amounts collected under [section] sections 138-4[-] and 138- . The board shall place the funds in an interest-10 bearing account at any federally insured financial institution, 11 12 separate and apart from the general fund of the State. Moneys in the fund shall be expended exclusively by the board for the 13 14 purposes of ensuring adequate funding to deploy and sustain enhanced 911 service, developing and funding future enhanced 911 15 technologies, and funding expenses of administering the fund." 16 17 SECTION 4. Section 138-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 19 The rate of the surcharge shall be set at 66 cents 20 per month for each communications service connection. The 21 surcharge shall have uniform application and shall be imposed on

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Report Title:

Prepaid Wireless; Enhanced 911 Services

Description:

Establishes a prepaid wireless E911 surcharge of 1.5 per cent of prepaid wireless service purchased at the point of sale. Allows sellers to deduct and retain 3 per cent of the surcharge that is collected for administrative purposes. Requires the amounts collected by the Enhanced 911 Board to be placed in the Enhanced 911 Fund. Effective on July 1, 2018. (SD1)
