### A BILL FOR AN ACT

1	RELATING TO HOMELAND SECURITY.			
2	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:			
3	SECTION 1. Chapter 128A, Hawaii Revised Statutes is			
4	amended by amending section 128A-3 to read as follows			
5	"[§128A-3] State office of homeland security. (a) There			
6	shall be established within the department of defense an office			
7	of homeland security and, subject to the direction and control			
8	of the governor, shall oversee the agency. The director of			
9	homeland security shall employ appropriate personnel and make			
10	expenditures as may be necessary to carry out this chapter. The			
11	director shall appoint an administrator of homeland security who			
12	shall be exempt from chapter 76, subject to removal by the			
13	director, and receive compensation as the director may			
14	determine.			
15	(b) The director shall be responsible for formulating and			
16	carrying out programs for homeland security. The director			
17	shall:			
18	(1) Ensure coordination and cooperation among all			
19	organizations for homeland security; public agencies,			
20	including county, state, and federal agencies; and			
21	private organizations; and			

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1	(2) Cooperate with county, state, and federal homeland		
2	security and law enforcement agencies."		
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 128A, Hawaii Revised Statutes is		
4	amended by adding a new section to read as follows		
5	"[§128A- ] Hawaii state fusion center. (a) The office		
6	shall establish and operate a state fusion center that shall be		
7	known as the Hawaii state fusion center. The director of		
8	homeland security, subject to the direction and control of the		
9	governor, shall oversee the hawaii state fusion center.		
10	(b) There shall be a hawaii state fusion center director		
11	who shall be appointed, and may be removed, by the director of		
12	homeland security. The director of the hawaii state fusion		
13	center shall be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the		
14	hawaii state fusion center. The director of the hawaii state		
15	fusion center shall not be subject to chapter 76.		
16	(c) The hawaii state fusion center shall		
17	(1) be continually staffed by to monitor all-crimes and		
18	hazards and shall be the focal point for sharing		
19	local, national, and international information and		
20	context with the national level intelligence		
21	community.

#### Description:

With the numbers of threats and incidents against the country which have arisen in the recent past, it is even more crucial that the State of Hawaii, as a strategic location in the Pacific, have all information necessary to guard against those who would do harm to the country and to the state. In the current atmosphere of increased terrorist activities, it is even more important that the Hawaii State Fusion Center be fully staffed and supported. This bill adds the fusion center as a program under the existing Office of Homeland Security and establishes the position of director of the fusion center who shall be responsible to the director of homeland security and accountable to manage the day-to-day operations of the fusion center.

Adds a new part to Chapter 128A establishing

establishing the position of a director for the Hawaii state fusion center under the direction of the administrator of the office

homeland security.

JUSTIFICATION:

This bill establishes the Hawaii state fusion center under the State office of homeland security. The center shall monitor all crime and hazards in the state and nationally and be the focal point for the sharing of local, state, national and international intelligence. The center will receive, analyze, and disseminate threat related information across multi-discipline partners. The center will integrate information technology, cybersecurity and cyber crime prevent, cyber and analytic capabilities and critical infrastructure and key resources lifelines

Impact on the public: The public will be better served and protected with improved communications and collaboration between state entities and national entities in matters related to intelligence and security

Impact on the department and other agencies: County, state, federal, and private sector agencies will have a more complete nexus for coordination and collaboration of information related to intelligence and security.
