A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELAND SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 128A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§128A- Hawaii state fusion center. (a) The office of
- 5 homeland security shall establish and operate a state fusion
- 6 center that shall be known as the Hawaii state fusion center.
- 7 The director of homeland security, subject to the direction and
- 8 control of the governor, shall oversee the Hawaii state fusion
- 9 center.
- 10 (b) There shall be a Hawaii state fusion center director
- 11 who shall be appointed, and may be removed, by the director of
- 12 homeland security. The director of the Hawaii state fusion
- 13 center shall be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the
- 14 Hawaii state fusion center. The director of the Hawaii state
- 15 fusion center shall not be subject to chapter 76, and the
- 16 position shall be funded by the State.
