A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that anti-tobacco
- 2 campaigns have played a major role in the overall decline of
- 3 cigarette smoking. A key tool of tobacco control has been
- 4 taxation, which has been shown to be particularly effective for
- 5 youths who are generally more price-sensitive and thus less
- 6 likely to start or maintain cigarette smoking.
- 7 The health effects of smoking are well established and
- 8 include increased risk of heart attack, stroke, and other
- 9 medical events to which Hawaii's emergency medical services
- 10 system routinely responds. A clear nexus can thus be
- 11 established between cigarette smoking and utilization of the
- 12 health care system. However, due to declining rates of smoking,
- 13 the long-term sustainability of the cigarette tax as a revenue
- 14 source for the emergency medical system special fund is in
- 15 jeopardy.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 17 (1) Repeal the emergency medical services special fund;



1	(2) Redirect the fund's revenue sources, which include the
2	cigarette tax, motor vehicle registration fee, and
3	investment pool returns, to the general fund; and
4	(3) Appropriate an equivalent dollar-for-dollar amount to
5	the department of health for purposes of overseeing
6	the statewide comprehensive emergency medical system.
7	In fiscal year 2015-2016, revenue collected from the \$5 per
8	vehicle registration fee was deposited into the special fund.
9	The emergency medical services special fund revenues from
10	vehicle registration fees in fiscal year 2015-2016 were
11	\$6,538,865.
12	In fiscal year 2015-2016, revenue collected from the 1.25
13	cents per cigarette sold was deposited into the emergency
14	medical system special fund. The emergency medical system
15	special fund revenues from cigarette sales in fiscal year 2015-
16	2016 were \$8,800,000.
17	The emergency medical system special fund revenues from the
18	investment pool account in fiscal year 2015-2016 were
19	\$151,502.46.
20	The emergency medical system special fund total revenues in

fiscal year 2015-2016 were \$15,490,367.46.

- 1 shall not be used to supplant funding for emergency medical
- 2 services authorized prior to [July 1, 2004].
- 3 (c) Fees remitted pursuant to section 249-31, cigarette
- 4 tax revenues designated under section 245-15, interest and
- 5 investment earnings attributable to the moneys in the special
- 6 fund, legislative appropriations, and grants, donations, and
- 7 contributions from private or public sources for the purposes of
- 8 the fund, shall be deposited into the special fund.

- 10 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 11 each regular session that outlines the receipts of, and

- 13 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 16 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 17 year 2018-2019 for the statewide comprehensive emergency medical
- 18 services system.
- 19 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 20 of health for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
