SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF PHARMACY TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO REVIEW THE CURRENT SCOPE OF PRACTICE, LICENSING REQUIREMENTS, AND CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR PHARMACISTS AND CONSIDER WHETHER THE SCOPE OF PRACTICE AND CORRESPONDING LICENSING REQUIREMENTS FOR PHARMACISTS SHOULD BE ENHANCED.

WHEREAS, there is a need for more access to health care 1 professionals, particularly registered pharmacists, who can 2 safely provide certain health care services and achieve positive 3 4 health outcomes for patients; and 5 WHEREAS, pharmacists have more direct access to patients 6 than other health care professionals, which can help resolve 7 8 public health issues with a minimal impact to the overall health 9 system; and 10 WHEREAS, advances in technology have changed the delivery 11 of health care over the last thirty years and as a result, the 12 definition of "practice of pharmacy" under existing law is no 13 longer accurate; and 14 15 WHEREAS, pharmacy education has also increased over the 16 years, from an apprentice program to a six-year doctorate 17 program that includes education assessment training and a year 18 19 working as a pharmacist intern; and 20 WHEREAS, pharmacy education now also includes immunization 21 22 and smoking cessation training, along with other specialty training, which ensures pharmacists are well prepared to provide 23 appropriate health care services to patients; and 24 25 WHEREAS, pharmacists have had a positive impact on public 26 27 health throughout the State and now immunize more patients than



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any other health care professional, which has increased the 1 2 State's immunization rate, thereby reducing disease and morbidity in the overall population; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, registered pharmacists who receive proper training, working under written protocols, can: 6 7 Provide health care services, such as furnishing 8 (1)9 Naloxone and Epi-pens; 10 Administer immunizations and vaccines for bacterial 11 (2) and viral infections, such as influenza, pneumonia, 12 and Hepatitis A; 13 14 Furnish and counsel patients on self-administered (3) 15 16 hormonal contraception and smoking cessation replacement therapy; and 17 18 19 (4)Order and perform laboratory tests to determine 20 appropriate medication use and outcomes; and 21 WHEREAS, the disciplines of medicine, nursing, and 22 naturopathy are complemented by registered pharmacists, who are 23 24 an essential part of a primary health care team; now, therefore, 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth 26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, the 27 House of Representatives concurring, that the Board of Pharmacy 28 is requested to convene a working group to review the current 29 30 scope of practice, licensing requirements, and continuing education requirements for pharmacists and consider whether the 31 scope of practice and corresponding licensing requirements for 32 pharmacists should be enhanced; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group be composed of the following members: 36 37 (1)The Chairperson of the Board of Pharmacy; 38 39 A representative from the Department of Health 40 (2) 41 designated by the Director of Health;
