SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING MARCH 19 AS HAWAII CELEBRATING WOMEN IN PUBLIC OFFICE DAY.

WHEREAS, the month of March is Women's History Month which 1 celebrates the significant contributions made by women of all 2 races, ethnicities, and backgrounds to the world; and 3 4 WHEREAS, while the twentieth century marked a pivotal time 5 of growth for women entering politics, a 2017 study by the 6 7 Center for American Women and Politics at Rutgers University shows that women hold less than twenty percent of seats in the 8 115th U.S. Congress, twenty-four percent of elective executive 9 offices, and twenty-five percent of seats in state legislatures 10 in the United States; and 11 12 WHEREAS, women continue to be underrepresented in male-13 dominated fields; thus, providing opportunities to support women 14 15 in public office is imperative; and 16 WHEREAS, women are critical to the vitality and diversity 17 of our communities and in ensuring Hawaii is well represented; 18 and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, Hawaii is ranked as one of the best states in terms of women's representation in elected offices at the state 22 23 and national level; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the recent surge and success of women candidates 26 running for public office in New Jersey and Virginia have 27 sparked a movement of women running for office; and 28 29 WHEREAS, recognizing women in public office will bring awareness to the value of their work and will inspire other 30 young people to serve their communities; now, therefore, 31 32



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BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, the House of Representatives concurring, that this body recognizes March 19 as Hawaii Celebrating Women in Public Office Day and calls upon the people of Hawaii to support the success of women in public office and observe every March 19 with appropriate activities, events, and programs; and
