SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION TO REQUIRE ALL TELEVISION STATIONS THAT BROADCAST IN HAWAII TO DEDICATE TIME SLOTS TO EDUCATE THE GENERAL PUBLIC THROUGH PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS ON HOW TO PREPARE FOR NATURAL AND MAN-MADE DISASTERS.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii's geographic location puts the islands at 2 risk of various natural disasters, such as tsunamis, hurricanes, 3 and tropical storms; and 4

5 WHEREAS, man-made disasters are also a threat to the safety 6 of Hawaii's residents and visitors, especially in light of 7 recent domestic and international events; and

9 WHEREAS, while there are safety measures in place in the
10 event of natural and man-made disasters, much of the public
11 remains unaware of the proper procedures to take during any type
12 of disaster; and

WHEREAS, the recent scare of a false ballistic missile threat proved that regardless of safety measures the State has in place, the public is not sufficiently educated on the necessary steps and procedures to take in the event of a real disaster; and

WHEREAS, although disaster procedures and related information are available online, not all of the public has access to the Internet; therefore, it is important to give the public a variety of means to access disaster procedures and related information to cover all the platforms of information dissemination, which includes television, radio, and the Internet; and

28 WHEREAS, all public broadcast messages or service 29 announcements need to be accessible to people with disabilities, 30 including people who are blind, deaf, or hard of hearing, or who 31 have cognitive disabilities; and

1 2 WHEREAS, all emergency and disaster planning efforts should be able to be communicated across various platforms so that no 3 4 population is left out; and 5 6 WHEREAS, public safety, especially in the context of emergency preparedness, can be effected through collaboration 7 with the federal government; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission regulates 11 interstate and international communications by radio, television, wire, satellite, and cable in the United States and 12 is the federal agency responsible for implementing and enforcing 13 14 the United States' communications law and regulations; now, 15 therefore, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, 18 19 that the Federal Communications Commission is requested to 20 require all television stations that broadcast in Hawaii to allocate time slots in their programs to broadcast public 21 22 service announcements to educate the public on how to prepare 23 for all disasters, natural and man-made, in Hawaii; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any and all information broadcast on local television stations that offer public service 26 announcements is requested to be: 27 28 29 (1)Accessible to people with disabilities, including through the use of audio descriptions for people who 30 are blind, open captions and sign language 31 interpreters for people who are deaf or hard of 32 33 hearing, and basic English for people with cognitive disabilities; 34 35 36 (2) Equivalent to information accessible to persons without disabilities; and 37 38 (3) Unobstructed by any other messages; and 39 40
