SENATE RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A TERM LEASE COVERING A PORTION OF
STATE SUBMERGED LANDS AT KAHALU'U, NORTH KONA, ISLAND OF
HAWAI'I.

1 WHEREAS, at its meeting on February 9, 2018, under agenda
2 item D-5, the Board of Land and Natural Resources approved a
3 sixty-five year direct lease between the State and the Trustees
4 of the Estate of Bernice Pauahi Bishop for approximately 3.992
5 acres of land at Kahalu'u, North Kona, Island of Hawai'i,
6 identified as tax map key number (3) 7-8-013: portions of 002
7 and 043; and
8

9 WHEREAS, the public purpose for the direct lease, as
10 approved, is for educational, cultural, and historic site
11 preservation purposes; and
12

13 WHEREAS, section 171-53(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes,
14 provides that the Board of Land and Natural Resources, with
15 prior approval of the Governor and prior authorization of the
16 Legislature by concurrent resolution, may lease state submerged
17 lands and lands beneath tidal waters under the terms,
18 conditions, and restrictions set forth in chapter 171, Hawaii
19 Revised Statutes; and

21 WHEREAS, section 171-43.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
22 provides that the Board of Land and Natural Resources may lease,
23 at a nominal consideration, public lands to an eleemosynary
24 organization that has been certified to be tax exempt under
25 section 501(c)(1) or 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of
26 1986, and that the public lands leased shall be used by an
27 eleemosynary organization for the purposes for which the
28 eleemosynary organization's charter was issued and for which the
29 eleemosynary organization was certified by the Internal Revenue
30 Service; and

32 WHEREAS, the Estate of Bernice Pauahi Bishop is certified
33 to be tax exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue
34 Code of 1986; and

1 WHEREAS, the Trustees of the Estate of Bernice Pauahi
2 Bishop propose to use the land subject to the direct lease as
3 part of the Kahalu'u Ma Kai Educational and Cultural Complex,
4 which the Trustees of the Estate of Bernice Pauahi Bishop find
5 is consistent with the Estate's mission of providing high
6 quality educational experiences for Native Hawaiian children and
7 families, and which will be the piko (center) of the Trustees'
8 educational offerings in the West Hawai'i region; and
9

10 WHEREAS, as part of the Kahalu'u Ma Kai Educational and
11 Cultural Complex, the Trustees of the Estate of Bernice Pauahi
12 Bishop propose to include a managed public access plan and the
13 restoration and interpretive management of several sacred heiau
14 and the Pa o Ka Menehune Fishpond, which are located adjacent to
15 the submerged lands subject to the direct lease; and
16

17 WHEREAS, a dispute previously arose between the Department
18 of Land and Natural Resources and the Trustees of the Estate of
19 Bernice Pauahi Bishop as to the location of the shoreline and
20 the ownership of the submerged lands subject to the direct
21 lease; and

23 WHEREAS, in order to work collaboratively rather than in
24 conflict, the Department of Land and Natural Resources and the
25 Trustees of the Estate of Bernice Pauahi Bishop have "agreed to
26 disagree" as to the location of the shoreline and the ownership
27 of the submerged lands, with the parties specifically reserving
28 all rights, claims, and defenses, and proceed to issue the
29 Trustees of the Estate of Bernice Pauahi Bishop the direct
30 lease; now, therefore,

32 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth
33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018,
34 that the Board of Land and Natural Resources is hereby
35 authorized to issue a lease of sixty-five years for
36 approximately 3.992 acres of land covering state submerged lands
37 at Kahalu'u, North Kona, Island of Hawai'i, identified as tax map
38 key number (3) 7-8-013: portions of 002 and 043 pursuant to
39 section 171-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and
