<u>SB 2202</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX. Exempts gross receipts from the sale of mobility enhancing equipment, durable medical equipment, prosthetic devices, prescription drugs sold pursuant to a doctor's prescription, diabetic supplies, medical oxygen, and human blood and its derivatives from the general excise tax. Amends the definition of "prosthetic device" to include devices worn on the body. Amends the definition of "prescription drugs".	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2664</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS. Codifies sustainable development goals based on the United Nations' Global Goal three, good health and well-being.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2010</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO DRUG TREATMENT. Appropriates funds for drug treatment for opioid abuse, methamphetamine abuse, heroin abuse, prescription drug abuse, and other drug abuse.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2658</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. Appropriates funds for one ambulance unit each for the county of Kauai and the county of Hawaii, including equipment, supplies, and personnel costs.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2891</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO TELEHEALTH. Appropriates funds for the Department of Health to conduct a telehealth pilot project.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2298</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HEALTHCARE PRECEPTOR TAX CREDITS. Allows advanced practice registered nurses, physicians, dentists, and pharmacists to receive tax credits for acting as preceptors in volunteer-based supervised clinical training rotations provided to eligible students that enable the students to obtain an eligible healthcare professional degree or certificate.	CPH, WAM
