<u>HB 2215</u> <u>(HSCR359-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BICYCLES. Requires the driver of a vehicle passing and overtaking a bicycle proceeding in the same direction to allow at least three feet of separation between the right side of the driver's vehicle and the left side of the bicyclist.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1942</u> <u>(HSCR300-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSING. Authorizes the issuance of limited purpose driver's licenses, limited purpose provisional driver's licenses, and limited purpose instruction permits to include applicants who voluntarily choose to obtain a REAL ID compliant State Civil Identification Card.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 2589, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR367-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTORCYCLES. Authorizes the Department of Transportation under certain conditions to designate shoulders upon which the department may authorize the driving of motorcycles. (HB2589 HD1)	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1938</u> <u>(HSCR364-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SCHOOL BUSES. Increases the fine to not more than \$1,000 for passing or overtaking a school bus on a state highway while the bus is stopped and its visual signals are turned on.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 2590, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR363-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AERONAUTICS. Replaces criminal penalties for certain airport offenses addressed in Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or in certain administrative rules or orders issued pursuant thereto, with a civil penalty. (HB2590 HD1)	TRN, JUD



<u>HB 2373, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR682-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE SHARING OF VITAL STATISTICS RECORDS WITH DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH PROGRAM EMPLOYEES FOR APPROVED RESEARCH PURPOSES. Authorizes the Department of Health, under specified circumstances, to disclose information in public health statistics records to Department employees acting within the scope of their employment upon approval by the Department's Institutional Review Committee. (HB2373 HD1)	HHS, JUD
<u>HB 1906, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR606-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE WORKERS. Makes intentionally or knowingly causing bodily injury to a health care worker a Class C felony. (HB1906 HD1)	LAB/HHS, JUD
<u>HB 2391, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR411-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIFORM CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT. Authorizes disclosure of information collected by the Electronic Prescription Accountability System to authorized employees of the Department of Health's Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division and Emergency Medical Services and Injury Prevention System Branch. (HB2391 HD1)	HHS, JUD
<u>HB 1893, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR727-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Allows for the medical use of cannabidiol products upon approval by the Federal Food and Drug Administration. (HB1893 HD1)	HHS, JUD
<u>HB 1650, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR531-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CHILD SAFETY. Authorizes disclosure of child abuse and neglect reports for incidents occurring in group child care homes or group child care centers to parents or guardians of children enrolled in the home or center at the time of the alleged abuse or neglect or to parents or guardians considering enrolling their children in the home or center. (HB1650 HD1)	HHS, JUD
<u>HB 2384, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR423-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIFORM CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT. Updates Uniform Controlled Substances Act for consistency with federal law. Allows prescription of drugs to patients undergoing medically managed withdrawal, also known as detoxification treatment and maintenance treatment, by practitioners who are properly registered. (HB2384 HD1)	HHS, JUD
<u>HB 2399, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR354-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Clarifies the definition of "drug" in chapter 291E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, regarding the use of intoxicants while operating a vehicle. (HB2399 HD1)	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 2385, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR412-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIFORM CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT. Updates chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to make it consistent with amendments in the federal Controlled Substances Act as required under section 329-11. (HB2385 HD1)	HHS, JUD
<u>HB 2617, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR372-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO OCEAN WATERS. Prohibits liquor consumption for bathers within one thousand yards of any beach or shoreline in the State. (HB2617 HD1)	OMH, JUD



<u>HB 2356</u> <u>(HSCR491-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY. Prohibits smoking in and around public housing projects and state low-income housing projects under the jurisdiction of the Hawaii Public Housing Authority and in and around elder or elderly housing.	HSG, JUD
<u>HB 2359, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR492-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY. Provides that certain areas within Hawaii Public Housing Authority housing projects are closed to the public and amends criminal trespass in the second degree to permit the prosecution of an unauthorized entry or a violation of a written prohibition to enter into the subject housing projects. Clarifies requirements for signage notifying trespassers of illegal entry. (HB2359 HD1)	HSG, JUD
<u>HB 1859, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR306-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CHILDREN. Allows a minor to petition the Family Court for emancipation, and directs the court regarding investigation of the petition, appointment of legal counsel and a guardian ad litem for the petitioner, and the findings necessary to grant the petition. Specifies the rights gained by the minor upon emancipation and authorizes the court to require the minor's parents or legal guardians to pay for any services ordered by the court. Requires emancipation proceedings to be stayed until final disposition of the minor's child protective case under Chapter 587A. (HB1859 HD1)	HHS, JUD
<u>HB 2173, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR701-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ONLINE ACCOUNT PRIVACY. Prohibits employers and educational institutions from requiring employees, students, and prospective employees and students to provide protected personal online account information. Authorizes private civil actions against violators. (HB2173 HD2)	LAB, CPC, JUD
<u>HB 2137, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR452-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EQUAL PAY. Prohibits prospective employers from requesting or considering a job applicant's wage or salary history as part of an employment application process or compensation offer. Prohibits enforced wage secrecy and retaliation or discrimination against employees who disclose, discuss, or inquire about their own or coworkers' wages. (HB2137 HD1)	LAB, JUD
<u>HB 2530, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR431-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CHILD CARE. Deletes the Department of Human Services' obligation to determine required liability insurance coverage amounts for regulated child care providers. Extends the implementation and enforcement date of liability insurance requirements for regulated child care providers contained in Act 161, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, until July 1, 2019. (HB2530 HD1)	HHS, CPC, JUD
<u>HB 1873, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR496-18)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. Requires annual distribution of any policy stating that the association may deduct and apply portions of common expense assessments to unpaid late fees, legal fees, fines, and interest and that such policy be included in any agreement by an owner that allows the association to automatically withdraw assessments from an owner's bank account. Requires an association to disclose certain information upon demand for payment of an assessment. (HB1873 HD1)	CPC, JUD
