<u>SB 2529</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO BICYCLES. Requires the driver of a vehicle overtaking a bicycle proceeding in the same direction to allow at least a three-foot separation between the right side of the driver's vehicle and the left side of the bicyclist.	TRE, JDC
<u>SB 2828</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS. Expands authority of the Director of Transportation over required motor carrier vehicle inspections.	TRE, WAM
<u>SB 2854</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO MOPEDS. Establishes a fine not to exceed \$100 for mopeds owners who fail to comply with moped registration requirements.	TRE, JDC/WAM
<u>SB 2888</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE PAIA BYPASS. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for appropriation funds to the department of transportation to plan, design, and construct the Pa'ia bypass.	TRE, WAM
<u>SB 2256</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HIGHWAY BEAUTIFICATION. Makes the motor vehicle registration fee for U-drive motor vehicles consistent with the fee for all other motor vehicles. Makes any county ordinance that increases a motor vehicle registration fee applicable to U-drive vehicles.	TRE, WAM
<u>SB 2551</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATED TO RESISTING AN ORDER TO STOP A MOTOR VEHICLE. Removes resisting an order to stop a motor vehicle in the first degree from the list of offenses for which criminal charges may be brought by written information.	TRE, JDC
<u>SB 2684</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE. Clarifies what pedestrians are required to do when in a crosswalk while a countdown timer is operating.	TRE, JDC



<p><u>SB 2715</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST A SEAWATER AIR CONDITIONING PROJECT IN HAWAII. Extends the authorization to issue special purpose revenue bonds to assist Kaiuli Energy, LLC, with the financing of the planning, design, and construction of a seawater air conditioning district cooling facility and chilled water distribution system.</p>	<p>TRE, WAM</p>
<p><u>SB 2912</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO TRAFFIC CONTROL. Permits the driver of a vehicle to safely proceed through an intersection in which a defective or malfunctioning traffic-control device fails to detect the vehicle and stays in the red signal stage through 2 cycles of the traffic-control device.</p>	<p>TRE, JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 2004</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO INSTALLATION OF A SIGNALIZED CROSSWALK ON VINEYARD BOULEVARD. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for appropriation to the Department of Transportation to complete the construction and installation of a signalized crosswalk on Vineyard boulevard at River street.</p>	<p>TRE, WAM</p>
