<u>SB 2619, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2626)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AERONAUTICS. Replaces criminal penalties for certain airport offenses addressed in Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or in certain administrative rules or orders issued pursuant thereto, with a civil penalty. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	TRN, JUD
<u>SB 2474, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2618)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO NOISE CONTROL. Requires the Department of Health, in collaboration with the Department of Transportation, to conduct a study on the impact of aviation noise on residents of the Puna district and surrounding areas of the Hawaii Volcanoes National Park. Appropriates funds to the Department of Health to conduct the study. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 2849, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2592)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION. Classifies certain former military vehicles as special interest vehicles. Enables owners of former military vehicles to apply for registration with the director of finance of the county in which the former military vehicle resides. Makes conforming amendments. (SD1)	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 3049, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2811)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. Assesses a \$10 motor vehicle importation fee for each motor vehicle that is imported into the State, due to the county that is the final destination of the vehicle. Provides that revenue from the motor vehicle importation fee shall be expended for the disposal of abandoned vehicles. (SD1)	TRN, FIN

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


