<u>HB 2445</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DIVORCE. Disallows a court, when dividing property upon the dissolution of a marriage, from considering military disability benefits or from indemnifying or awarding the veteran's spouse for waivers or reductions in military pay related to disability benefits. DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:
