<u>HB16</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC ORDER. Prohibits urinating and defecating in public places. Establishes graduated fines as penalties for violations.	HHS, JUD
<u>HB21</u>	RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX. Exempts gross receipts from the sale of mobility enhancing equipment and durable medical equipment from the general excise tax. Amends the definition of "prosthetic device" to include devices worn on the body. Exempts gross receipts from the repair of prosthetic devices from the general excise tax.	HHS, FIN
<u>HB37</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA. Amends Hawaii Revised Statutes and Hawaii Administrative Rules to substitute references to "medical marijuana" and like terms with "medical cannabis" and like terms.	HHS, JUD

HB48 RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA. HHS, CPC, JUD

Requires the department of health to adopt rules to prohibit: (1) the manufacture and sale of manufactured marijuana products that are shaped to appeal to children; and (2) the use of additives in manufactured marijuana products designed to make the product more addictive or more appealing to minors.

HB61 RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE. HHS, TRN, JUD

Prohibits smoking in a motor vehicle in which a minor is present. Requires the Department of Health to report on the enforceability of the prohibition and coordination of data collection efforts of the respective law enforcement agencies.

HB62 RELATING TO CANCER. HHS, FIN

Creates the colorectal cancer screening and awareness pilot program within the department of health and appropriates funds for the program. Repeals on 6/30/2020.

RELATING TO MEDICAID. HB93, HD1

HHS, FIN

Requires insurers that contract with the Department of Human Services, to provide a medically complex add-on payment of 40 percent of the Medicaid base rate for medical enrollees in longterm care facilities with complex medical, behavioral, mental health, and cognitive needs who are waitlisted at an acute care hospital. Appropriates funds for medically complex add-on payments. (HB93 HD1)

RELATING TO INSURANCE. HB109

HHS, CPC, FIN

Provides insurance coverage for air travel and lodging for blind or disabled individuals living on neighbor islands requiring medical care on the island of Oahu and their attendants. Applies to health insurance policies, contracts, and plans issued or renewed after July 1, 2018.

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE HB111

HHS, FIN

HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION.

Makes an emergency appropriation to provide funds to the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 for Maui Memorial Medical Center, Kula Hospital and Clinic,

and Lanai Community Hospital.

RELATING TO FERAL CATS. HB122

HHS, FIN

Appropriates funds to the Department of Health to enable it to contract with eligible non-profit or charitable organizations, private entities, or public entities to trap, neuter or spay, and release feral cats to the location where they were originally trapped.

HHS, JUD

Allows a terminally ill adult with the capacity to make an informed healthcare decision to request a prescription for aid in dying medication from their attending physician to facilitate a peaceful death. Ensures that physicians who assist patients in obtaining aid in dying medication are not subject to civil or criminal liability.

HB216 RELATING TO COMMUNITY PARAMEDIC SERVICES.

HHS, FIN

Implements the recommendations of the working group convened pursuant to House Concurrent Resolution No. 90, Regular Session of 2016, by establishing and appropriating funds for a three-year community paramedic services pilot program. Requires a report to the Legislature before the Regular Session of 2021.

HB248, HD2 RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

HHS, CPC, FIN

Specifies procedural, disclosure, notice, and other requirements for prospective reviews required by health carriers or utilization review organizations prior to certification of coverage for health care services. (HB248 HD2)

HB249 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HHS, FIN

Appropriates moneys for DOH lead poisoning prevention

activities.

HB250 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

HHS, JUD

Entitles designated family members and other interested persons of a person having a mental health emergency to: notice of certain procedures and actions, option to be present in the courtroom for a hearing on a petition for involuntary hospitalization or assisted community treatment, and option to receive copies of hearing transcripts or recordings. Requires the court to adjourn or continue a hearing on a petition for involuntary hospitalization or assisted community treatment for failure to timely notify designated persons, with certain exceptions.

HB263, HD2 RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA.

HHS, FIN

Amends provisions related to licensed medical marijuana dispensaries by imposing GET on a percentage of dispensaries gross proceeds or gross income and allocating a portion of GET revenues received from dispensaries to the Medical Marijuana Registry and Regulation Special Fund. (HB263 HD2)

Requires outsourcing facilities to obtain a permit from the Board

of Pharmacy before providing medications to healthcare

providers.

HB371 RELATING TO DISPOSABLE FOOD CONTAINERS.

EEP, HHS, CPC

Prohibits the use of polystyrene food containers in state-owned and state-run buildings and facilities beginning 1/1/18. Requires that food be packed in compostable containers. Authorizes DOH

to allow exemptions.

HB392 RELATING TO HEALTH COVERAGE FOR BRAIN

HHS, CPC, FIN

INJURIES.

Requires certain insurance contracts and plans to provide coverage beginning 1/1/2017 for treatment of brain injuries, including cognitive and neurocognitive therapy, neurobehavioral and neuropsychological testing or treatment, and necessary post-acute transition services or community reintegration activities for a period of at least twenty years from the date the injury occurred and up to a lifetime cap per person of \$300,000. Defines

"cognitive rehabilitation therapy".

HB407, HD3, SD1 RELATING TO INSURANCE.

HHS, IAC, CPC

Authorizes the issuance of employer-sponsored high deductible health plans, if certain conditions are met. Requires maintenance of health savings accounts in conjunction with high deductible health plans. Specifies that employers and insurers that buy or sell high deductible health plans remain subject to the Prepaid Health Care Act. Effective 7/1/2050. Repeals 6/30/2022. (SD1)

HB429 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

HHS/LAB, HED

Prohibits smoking and tobacco use, including the use of

electronic smoking devices, by any person on the premises of the

University of Hawaii.

HB433 RELATING TO CARE FACILITY INSPECTIONS.

HHS, FIN

Appropriates funds to the department of health for the posting of

care facility inspection reports on the department's website.

<u>HB449</u> RELATING TO MARIJUANA.

HHS, JUD, FIN

Legalizes under state law the growing, processing, possession, transfer, and personal use of marijuana in a specified quantity to persons at least twenty-one years of age. Requires licensing to operate marijuana establishments. Specifies the application and non-application of the Internal Revenue Code to expenses related to the production and sale of marijuana and marijuana products for state income tax purposes. Specifies that amounts received for the sale of marijuana or marijuana products are not exempt from the state general excise tax. Establishes a tax on the sale of marijuana, marijuana products, and manufactured marijuana products. Establishes an education special fund, into which marijuana tax revenues are to be deposited.

<u>HB467</u> RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN PUBLIC

EMPLOYMENT.

Creates 7 separate collective bargaining units for employees of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation.

<u>HB468, HD1</u> RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN PUBLIC

HHS, LAB, FIN

EMPLOYMENT.

Establishes collective bargaining unit (15) for employees with the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation. (HD1)

HB536 RELATING TO FOWL.

HHS, FIN

Appropriates funds to the Department of Health to purchase traps for feral chickens and roosters and rent traps at a nominal fee to residents. Permits the Department of Health to contract with eligible non-profit or for-profit entities for that purpose.

HB538 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HHS, FIN

Requires the Department of Health to: (1) charge and collect fees for the licensing, relicensing, certification, and recertification of community care facilities; and (2) submit a report to the Legislature prior to the 2018 Regular Session on implementation of the fees.

HB548 RELATING TO HEALTH-CARE.

HHS, JUD

Provides that an individual acting as agent, guardian, or surrogate regarding health-care decisions may be awarded damages upon prevailing in a civil action.

<u>HB549</u> RELATING TO ADVANCE HEALTH-CARE DIRECTIVES.

HHS, JUD

Clarifies the immunity of agents, surrogates, and guardians in making a health-care decision regarding a patient's advance

health-care directive.

HB550 RELATING TO DEATH WITH DIGNITY. HHS, JUD

Authorizes terminally ill adults seeking to end their life to request lethal doses of medication from medical and osteopathic physicians.

HB551 RELATING TO HEALTH. HHS. FIN

Authorizes the Department of Health (DOH) to maintain a forum on its website where specified state-licensed care facilities may post vacancy information. Requires DOH to convene a working group to discuss and provide feedback on the implementation and maintenance of the forum. Appropriates funds.

HB559 RELATING TO HEALTH. HHS, FIN

Establishes a suicide prevention task force to develop a strategic plan to reduce suicide in Hawaii by 25% by 2025.

HB560 RELATING TO DENTAL LICENSURE. HHS/IAC, CPC

Expands the required qualifications that applicants may fulfill as part of the requirements for dental licensure to include passage of other examinations substantively similar to ADEX and dental licensure in another state, along with other qualifications.

HB562 RELATING TO DENTISTRY. HHS, CPC

Clarifies that a dentist who has not successfully completed the education specified for the dental specialty as defined by the American Dental Association may be subject to license suspension or revocation or a fine if the dentist uses words or phrases in advertising that are similar to the existing list of prohibited words or phrases. Expands the prohibited words or phrases to include "dentistry for children".

DENTAL HYGIENE.

Changes the name of the Board of Dental Examiners to the Board of Dentistry and Dental Hygiene (Board). Allows neighbor island Board members to attend meetings via teleconference. HB667, HD1 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HHS, JUD

Requires execution of an informed consent agreement between a patient and prescriber of opioids in circumstances that carry a high risk of dependency. Limits initial opioid prescription to a seven-day supply except for treatment of substance abuse or dependency, cancer, or palliative or hospice care. (HB667 HD1)

HB672, HD2, SD2 RELATING TO SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH SERVICES.

HHS, EDN, FIN

Formally establishes the Hawaii Keiki: Healthy and Ready to Learn Program within the Department of Education. Establishes a dedicated special fund and positions within the Departments of Education, Health, and Human Services to support the program.

Makes appropriations. Effective 7/1/2090. (SD2)

HB675 RELATING TO CONTRACEPTIVE SUPPLIES.

HHS, CPC

Authorizes pharmacists to prescribe and dispense selfadministered hormonal contraceptive supplies to patients, regardless of a previous prescription from an authorized

prescriber. Specifies requirements pharmacists must meet prior

to prescribing and dispensing contraceptive supplies.

HB676, HD1 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HHS, CPC

Authorizes pharmacists to administer the human papillomavirus, meningococcal, influenza, or tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis vaccines to persons between eleven and seventeen years of age pursuant to a prescription issued by the person's primary care

provider. (HB676 HD1)

HB677 RELATING TO IN VITRO FERTILIZATION INSURANCE

HHS, CPC, FIN

COVERAGE.

Amends insurance coverage requirements for in vitro fertilization

to allow for expanded applicability.

HB687 RELATING TO INSURANCE.

HHS, CPC, FIN

Adopts provisions from the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act relating to the extension of dependent coverage and the prohibition of preexisting condition exclusions.

Takes effect upon the repeal of the federal act.

<u>HB694</u> RELATING TO HEALTH.

HHS, FIN

Sets time limit for the grant or denial of an application for an initial or renewed certificate of approval to operate a community care foster family home or any community-based care home or facility licensed or certified under the Department of Health. Authorizes an application fee and sets fee amounts.

HB695 RELATING TO HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES.

HHS. FIN

Requires each licensed home and community-based case management agency to report to the Department on all referrals that were made by the agency, and to note in its report if any referral fee was paid to the agency, and the amount received for the referral. Requires the Department of Health to annually publish and revise a list of all licensed home and community-based case management agencies, including all information regarding referrals made to the agency and the amount paid to the agency for the referral, if any.

HB696, SD1 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HHS, CPC, FIN

Part I: changes the name of the board of dental examiners to the board of dentistry and dental hygiene; beginning on 7/1/2018, changes the board composition by increasing dental hygienist representation and ensuring Oahu and neighbor island representation among dental hygienist members. Part II: clarifies the allowable and prohibited practices requirements for dental assistants; clarifies that rules shall not infringe upon, overlap with, or conflict with the duties and scope of practice for licensed professionals; and prohibits persons from employing, directing, or ordering a dental assistant or other person to perform services or procedures within the scope of practice of dental hygiene. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

HB709 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE COORDINATION.

HHS, FIN

Appropriates \$1,500,000 for the public-private partnership established for administrative purposes to implement a model of health care delivery in Maui county that addresses coordination of care in a seamless, efficient, appropriate, and cost-effective manner.

HB749, HD2 RELATING TO SOLID WASTE.

EEP, HHS, FIN

Requires the Department of Health and the counties to consider waste-to-energy as part of their solid waste management practices and processing methods in implementing the Hawaii Integrated Solid Waste Management Act. (HB749 HD2)

HHS. FIN

HHS, JUD

HHS, FIN

<u>HB767, HD1</u> RELATING TO PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY FOR

CERTAIN CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGISTS.

Authorizes and establishes procedures and criteria for prescriptive authority for clinical psychologists who meet specific education, training, and registration requirements. Requires the Board of Psychology to report to the Legislature

prior to the Regular Session of 2021. (HB767 HD1)

HB779 RELATING TO VACCINES.

Exempts from vaccination, revaccination, or immunization requirements of the Department of Health, any person who objects in writing to the requirements due to the person's philosophical beliefs. Replaces the Director of Health's

discretion to overcome an individual's objection because of an epidemic with authority to order unvaccinated individuals to self-

quarantine at home.

HB782 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

Appropriates funds to improve the health care services related to

cardiac care at Kona community hospital, including the construction of a hybrid catheterization lab and operating room and funding of cardiology staff positions to alleviate the lack of

care.

<u>HB797</u> RELATING TO PHARMACISTS. HHS, CPC

Authorizes pharmacies to dispense controlled substances, other than Schedule II substances, without an authorization to refill a

prescription under limited conditions.

<u>HB800</u> RELATING TO MINORS. HHS, CPC, JUD

Prohibits persons licensed to provide professional counseling from engaging in, attempting to engage in, or advertising sexual orientation change efforts on persons under eighteen years of

age.

Establishes additional mandatory elements to Hawaii's existing sexuality health education law to include general knowledge about sexual abuse and sexual assault, and the prevention, identification, safety resources, and health resources for victims of sexual abuse and sexual assault.

HB874, HD1 RELATING TO HOUSING.

HHS, FIN

Requires use of an unspecified percentage of funds in the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Special Fund to provide housing for residents who qualify for Social Security disability benefits and are diagnosed with a life-long serious mental illness. (HB874

HD1)

HB885 RELATING TO DELAY IN PRIOR APPROVAL FOR

MEDICAL SERVICES.

HHS, CPC, JUD,

FIN

Prohibits health insurance preauthorization requirements that cause undue delay in receipt of medical treatment or services. Specifies that insurers, but not health care providers, are liable for civil damages caused by undue delays for preauthorization.

HHS, LAB, FIN

FIREFIGHTERS.

Improves access for firefighters to comprehensive medical coverage and service-connected disability retirement benefits upon diagnosis with or death from cancer that is presumed to arise out of and in the course of employment. Effective

7/1/2050. (SD1)

HB914, HD2 RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

HHS, CPC, FIN

Requires a health carrier with a network plan to maintain a network that provides sufficient practitioners and services to meet the needs of the enrollees or members. (HB914 HD1)

HB915 RELATING TO AIR AMBULANCE SERVICES.

HHS, CPC/JUD,

FIN

Requires health care facilities to first request transport services from an air ambulance that is contracted with the patient's health carrier when transferring a patient to another health care facility via air ambulance. Requires notification if a non-contracted air ambulance service is utilized. Establishes a procedure for

Requires DCCA to submit annual report regarding physician discipline related to medical marijuana certifications. Requires DOH to submit monthly report on medical marijuana

certifications. Requires Hawaii medical board to investigate potential misconduct regarding medical marijuana, take appropriate disciplinary action, and submit annual report.

HB929 RELATING TO HEALTH. HHS, EDN, JUD

RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

HHS, CPC, FIN

Requires all health insurers, including health benefits plans under chapter 87A, HRS, to disclose on, or have accessible through, their public web sites any medical policies used for making preauthorization decisions. (SB287 HD1)

SB301, SD2

RELATING TO RECYCLING.

HHS/EEP, FIN

Mandates implementation of recommendations made by the office of the auditor to the department of health regarding advance disposal fee glass containers and glass recycling. Requires the department of health to report on its implementation of the recommendations to the legislature. Appropriates funds to the department of health to conduct a cost-benefit analysis of combining the glass processing streams of the advance disposal fee glass containers and deposit beverage containers. Effective 6/1/2050. (SD2)

SB1221, SD2 RELATING TO FOOD SAFETY.

EDB, HHS, FIN

Appropriates funds to DBEDT in each of fiscal years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 to address the FDA's industry guidance on the use of color additives in sea salt products. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

RELATING TO THE LICENSURE OF MIDWIVES. SB1312, SD2

HHS, CPC, FIN

Establishes the board of midwifery to regulate the practice of midwifery by certified midwives and certified professional midwives. Requires licensing of certified midwives and certified professional midwives to commence beginning on July 1, 2020. Requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs to convene a working group of interested stakeholders and submit a report to the legislature. Effective July 1, 2050. (SD2)
