HB2143 RELATING TO BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS SERVICES. HHS, CPC

Clarifies the scope of practice of behavior analysis. Clarifies who may provide behavior analysis and applied behavior analysis services regardless of licensure status, including licensed individuals working within an overlapping scope of practice, individuals supervised by a licensed professional of an avardancing scope of practice, and agreeivers.

HB2144 RELATED TO MEDICAID. HHS/PBS, FIN

Requires the Department of Human Services to suspend rather than terminate an individual's medicaid eligibility upon entry into a correctional facility. Requires the Department of Public Safety to inform inmates of the availability of assistance to secure or verify applicable medicaid eligibility prior to an

inmate's release.

<u>HB2172</u>	RELATING TO UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS. Allows the University of Hawaii to enter into public-private partnerships and establish an Office of Strategic Partnerships and Development to specifically analyze, evaluate, recommend, coordinate, oversee, and manage public-private partnerships that would benefit the University of Hawaii. <u>HB2173</u>	RELATING TO ONLINE ACCOUNT PRIVACY. Prohibits employers and educational institutions from requiring employees, students, and prospective employees and students to provide protected personal online account information. Committee REFERRAL HB2174 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, EDB, FIN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM. Establishes the high-growth grant program and special fund to provide grants to qualified businesses for certain business development activities. Makes an appropriation. RELATING TO METROPOLITAN PLANNING HB2175 TRN, FIN ORGANIZATIONS. Requires any metropolitan planning organization serving a metropolitan planning area within the jurisdiction of a county that includes at least three islands inhabited by permanent residents to include on its policy board one member of the senate and one member of the house of representatives. HB2176 RELATING TO EDUCATION. LAB, JUD, FIN Bars judicial review of Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' decisions on protests to the award of procurement contracts for student transportation or education facility construction. Requires parties who protest the award of a contract to pay attorney fees and costs resulting from the delay of the contract if the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs upholds the Chief Procurement Officer's decision denying the protest. HB2177 RELATING TO HIGHWAY BEAUTIFICATION. TRN, FIN Makes the motor vehicle registration fee for U-drive motor vehicles consistent with the fee for all other motor vehicles. Makes any county ordinance that increases a motor vehicle registration fee applicable to U-drive vehicles. RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. LAB, FIN HB2178 Removes \$10,000 maximum limit on a cash or protest bond that must be posted for a procurement award protest.

HB2179 RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

JUD, FIN

Enacts voting by mail uniformly across all counties for all elections commencing in 2020, and allows any election to be conducted by mail prior to the 2020 primary election, in whole or in part, as determined by the chief election officer or county clerk, as appropriate. Establishes a limited number of voter service centers, with a minimum of two on each island with a population over 75,000, that would remain open from the tenth business day preceding an election through the day of the election to receive personal delivery of mail-in ballots, accommodate voters with special needs, offer same day registration and voting, and provide other election services. Allows for additional places of deposit for personal delivery of mail-in ballots. Appropriates funds for the implementation and administration of the election by mail program. Requires the office of elections to submit a report to the legislature prior to the convening of each regular session from 2019 through 2024, regarding the implementation of a vote by mail system. Takes effect on 1/1/2020.

<u>HB2180</u> RELATING TO A SEX TRAFFICKING EMERGENCY

HHS, FIN

SHELTER.

Allows DHS to establish or contract with a victim service provider to operate and manage a sex trafficking emergency shelter. Provides for tax and fee exemptions. Makes an appropriation.

HB2181 RELATING TO PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY.

VMI, FIN

Establishes each December 7 of each year as Pearl Harbor

Remembrance Day.

HB2182 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

EEP, FIN

Makes permanent the carbon farming task force established by Act 33, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, and renames the task force the carbon sequestration task force. Aligns the State's clean energy and carbon sequestration efforts with climate initiative goals. Requires 1 of the members of the Carbon Sequestration Task Force to also be a member of the Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission. Expands the mission of the Carbon Sequestration Task Force by requiring that the task force identify practices and policies to add trees or vegetation to expand the urban tree canopy. Makes an appropriation.

<u>HB2183</u> RELATING TO STATUTORY REVISION: AMENDING OR JUD

REPEALING VARIOUS PROVISIONS OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES AND THE SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII FOR THE PURPOSES OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES, CLARIFYING LANGUAGE, AND DELETING OBSOLETE OR UNNECESSARY PROVISIONS. Amends or repeals various provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes and the Session Laws of Hawaii for the purposes of correcting errors and references, clarifying language, and deleting obsolete or unnecessary provisions.

HB2184 RELATING TO THE LICENSURE OF MIDWIVES. HHS, CPC, FIN

Establishes the criteria for licensure of midwives by the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Provides for interim rules for continuing education requirements, standards of professional conduct, prescriptive authority, and penalties for violations. Appropriates funds.

HB2185 RELATING TO SCHOOL BASED HEALTH. EDN, HHS, FIN

Appropriates funds for positions to increase school-health coordination for and among the Department of Education, Department of Health, and Department of Human Services. Establishes evidence-based screenings and assessment for school vision, oral health, and behavioral health.

HB2186 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EMERGENCY HHS, FIN

MEDICAL SERVICES.

Appropriates funds for one ambulance unit each for the county of Kauai and the county of Hawaii, including equipment, supplies, and personnel costs.

HB2187 RELATING TO TAXATION. TOU, FIN

Amends the definition of "gross rental proceeds" to provide that the transient accommodations tax for sales of transient accommodations that are arranged by transient accommodations brokers shall be calculated based on the amount charged by the transient accommodations broker, rather than the amount received by the operator of the transient accommodations.

HB2188 RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE REAPPORTIONMENT. JUD, FIN

Defines "permanent resident" for legislative reapportionment as any individual counted as a usual resident of the State in the last preceding United States census and requires reapportionment to be done using data on the total number of permanent residents in

the State.

Provides that a court of inferior jurisdiction may certify to the Hawaii Supreme Court a question or proposition of law on which the court of inferior jurisdiction seeks instruction for the proper decision of a remanded case. Requires the Supreme Court to answer the question within 15 calendar days.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB2195</u>	RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTY-SEVENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the benefit of the 37th Representative District.	FIN
<u>HB2196</u>	RELATING TO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS. Establishes a pilot program to retrofit various Department of Education buildings to withstand a category 4 hurricane. Appropriates funds.	VMI/PBS, FIN

HB2197 RELATING TO THE LAND USE COMMISSION. WAL, JUD, FIN

Requires the Land Use Commission to monitor and evaluate the enforcement of laws on conservation lands by the Department of Land and Natural Resources. Requires the Land Use Commission to submit an annual report to the Legislature regarding its findings.

RELATING TO WATERSHEDS. HB2198

WAL, FIN

Establishes the watershed task force to define the term

"watershed". Appropriates moneys.

RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. HB2199

WAL/OMH, JUD,

Limits the term of public land leases, including extensions, to no FIN more than 85 years. Increases the term of specified leases, including the initial and extension periods, upon a showing of significant economic hardship, to 75 years. Requires BLNR to

submit annual reports to the Legislature regarding the status of public lands, including ceded lands and lands that can be immediately leased for agriculture or affordable housing.

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. HB2200

LAB, JUD

Allows an employer to seek a temporary restraining order and injunction against further harassment of an employee or invitee who may be harassed at the employer's premises or worksite.

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT. HB2201

LAB, JUD

Clarifies that Hawaii's anti-discrimination law does not prohibit

or prevent an employer, employment agency, or labor

organization from refusing to hire or refer or from discharging an individual for reasons unrelated to unlawful discriminatory

practices.

HB2202 RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION. LAB, CPC, FIN

Provides that a duly qualified physician or duly qualified surgeon selected and paid for by an employer to perform a medical examination on an employee relating to a work injury under workers' compensation shall be duly qualified to treat the injury being examined, possess medical malpractice insurance, and owe the same duty of care to the injured employee as to a

traditional patient.

HB2203 RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

Establishes an enforcement division in the Department of the Attorney General. Transfers to the Department of the Attorney General enforcement division the law enforcement activities of the Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement; the Department of Public Safety state law enforcement officers and the narcotics enforcement division; and the Department of Transportation harbors division. Repeals the sunset of Act 116, SLH 2013, as amended by section 4 of Act 101, SLH 2015. Effective 7/1/2019.

HB2204

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

Establishes a task force that shall develop a restructured welfare payment system and re-establishes the exit and retention bonus program to encourage welfare recipients to transition back into the workforce. Appropriates funds.

HB2205

RELATING TO LABOR.

Defines utility work, amends the definition of construction, and amends the wages and hours of employees on public works law to include certain activities performed by workers in electric, natural gas, water, sewer, and other utility industries.

HB2206

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

Provides an insurer with an exception to the requirement of providing all of its customers with annual privacy notices where the insurer provides nonpublic personal financial information to nonaffiliated third parties under certain conditions and the insurer's policies and practices regarding disclosure of such information are unchanged.

RELATING TO DENTAL ASSISTANTS.

Requires the Board of Dental Examiners to adopt rules to establish a regulatory structure for the regulation of dental assistants in Hawaii.

HB2208

RELATING TO ASSOCIATION HEALTH PLANS.

Requires association health plan policies to comply with the laws of this State regardless of the association's domicile. Enables certain voluntary associations, including employer associations that issue association health plans, to qualify for

authorization to transact insurance in the State.

REFERRAL HB2209 RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. HHS, CPC, FIN Establishes an individual mandate for certain qualified taxpayers to sign up and maintain health insurance throughout the year, or pay a penalty on their individual income tax return. HB2210 RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY. TRN, JUD Adds definition for highly intoxicated driver. Establishes evidence and sentencing parameters for highly intoxicated drivers. Establishes minimum and maximum administrative license revocation periods for highly intoxicated drivers. RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. HB2211 HHS, JUD, FIN Appropriates funds to satisfy state and federal class action settlement agreements requiring the Department of Human Services to implement a foster care maintenance payment system that complies with the federal Child Welfare Act, to increase clothing allowance payments, to reimburse certain caregivers and beneficiaries for past inadequate benefit payments, and comply with additional settlement terms. RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC HB2212 WAL, JUD ADMINISTRATION. Establishes the offense of obstructing county real property zoning enforcement operations. Makes the offense a class C felony. RELATING TO ZERO-EMISSION VEHICLES. HB2213 EEP/TRN, CPC, Establishes a Rental Motor Vehicle Emissions Surcharge Tax. FIN Requires lessors of rental motor vehicles to incorporate zeroemission vehicles into their rental motor vehicle fleets. Establishes the Zero-emissions Vehicle Infrastructure Grant Program to develop fueling infrastructure for zero-emission vehicles. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO AN AIRPORTS CORPORATION. HB2214 TRN, LAB/JUD, Authorizes the establishment of the Hawaii airports corporation FIN within the department of transportation for administrative purposes. Sets out appointment of members to the board of directors and powers and duties of the Hawaii airport corporation. Transfers the aeronautics functions of DOT to the Hawaii airports corporation by the established transfer completion date agreed upon by Hawaii airports corporation, the director of transportation, and the governor, which shall be no
