The Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board (Board) is established under Section 6E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Board orders and enters historic properties into the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places and evaluates and recommends nominations to the National Register of Historic Places.

Mr. McDermott was born and raised in Hawai'i. He has been working in archaeology since 1989. Mr. McDermott earned his Masters degree in anthropology from the University of Hawaii in 2001. Since 2004, he has worked as a project manager for Cultural Surveys Hawaii, Inc., overseeing archaeological projects. Mr. McDermott has extensive knowledge of the archaeology of Hawaii, especially in the context of historic preservation. He is just completing a term as a member of this Board.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Mr. McDermott's valuable knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board until June 30, 2022.
