RE: Testimony in Support of HB 2025, RELATING TO NUTRIENT CYCLING

To the Honorable Chris Lee, Chair; the Honorable Nicole E. Lowen, Vice-Chair, and Members of the Committee on Energy & Environmental Protection:

Good morning, my name is Melodie Aduja. I serve as Chair of the Oahu County Committee ("OCC") Legislative Priorities Committee of the Democratic Party of Hawaii. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on House Bill No. 2025, relating to a Composting Pilot Project for DOE schools and establishing a Composting Working Group to report to the Regular Session 2019 20 days before the commencement of the Regular Systems. The OCC Legislative Priorities Committee is in favor of House Bill No 2025, and support its passage.

House Bill No. 2025, is in alignment with the Platform of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i ("DPH"), 2016, as it authorizes the Department of Education to issue grants to establish a composting grant pilot project in Department of Education schools.it also establishes Establishes a composting grant pilot project working group. Requires report to the Legislature. Appropriates funds no later than 20 days prior to convening the 2020 Regular Session. Specifically, the DPH Platform states that "[w]e promote solid waste policies that divert green waste and food scraps for making invasive-species-free compost and enhanced mulch available for our farmers, landscapers, and residents. . . .

The Democratic Party of Hawai'i believes that the preservation and restoration of our natural environment are essential. We support a sustainable society that utilizes the earth in such a way that future generations will benefit from the practices of our generation. We support the restoration, preservation, and protection of our native ecosystems on each island. We believe in integrated approaches, practices, and support public policies that create and maintain a sustainable way of life in Hawai'i.

We believe in supporting best management practices in sustaining our environment and in increased citizen involvement. We support programs that encourage sustainable clean, efficient, creative and environmentally friendly modes of transportation, recycling and waste reduction. . . .

We believe in the vigorous enforcement of our environmental laws and increased public-private stewardships and citizen involvement in protecting our resources." (Platform of the DPH, P. 3, Lines 115-116, P. 8, Lines 406-415, 432-433 (2016)).

Given that House Bill No. 2025 provides for a Composting Pilot Project in DOE schools, which will benefit the agricultural industry and the environment through solid waste food recycling, it is the position of the OCC Legislative Priorities Committee to support this measure.

Aloha,

My name is Lindsey Whitcomb and I am writing in support of HB2025. My experience with this topic is via my work at Kailua area elementary schools as part of the Windward Zero Waste Hui, where all food waste for breakfast and lunch is composted daily. For the calendar year of 2017, our hui successfully diverted 30 tons of food waste from three schools & processed the waste on site.

In addition to the importance of reducing the amount of methane-producing waste being compiled in waste sites, the learning opportunities for students involved are numerous and varied. All students separating their food waste from non-compostable rubbish are learning about important aspects of reducing their personal environmental footprint. Students assisting with waste separation learn important fundamentals of data collection, reinforcement of math skills, and basics of the biology and chemistry involved in food decomposition. Above all of this, endless opportunities exist for teachers of students of all ages to incorporate either composting or gardening lessons into their curriculum. I hope for your support in this endeavor.
