- Fiscal Implications: H.B. 2169 HD1 requests an unspecified amount of general funds for fiscal
- 2 year 2018-2019 for youth suicide early intervention, prevention, and education initiatives in
- 3 Maui county. The Department defers to the Governor's Executive Budget request for
- 4 appropriations and personnel priorities.
- 5 Department Testimony: The Department of Health supports the intent of H.B. 2169 H.D.1.
- 6 Between 2010 -2016 there were 150 suicides among all residents aged 10 to 24 years, making
- 7 suicide the leading cause of injury death for this age group. The 150 suicides accounted for 28%
- 8 of all deaths among residents of this age, and 40% of the injury-related deaths. The annual
- 9 number varied from 24 to 38 deaths per year. For every youth who dies from suicide in Hawaii,
- there are an estimated 8 (239 per year) who are hospitalized and another 18 (540 per year) who
- are treated in emergency departments (ED) for nonfatal self-inflicted injuries each year.
- Rates of suicide among youth are higher for all Neighbor Islands in comparison to Honolulu
- 13 County. EMSIPSB data shows that youth suicide and attempted suicide are significantly higher
- in rural communities compared to Oahu
- Given the higher rates of youth suicide in rural communities, the Emergency Medical Services
- and Injury Prevention System Branch respectively recommends that H.B. 2169 H.D.1 be amended
- to include the distribution of funds for youth suicide early intervention, prevention and education
- initiatives to Hawaii County, Kauai County, and Maui County.
