TESTIMONY By Kaʻanoʻi Walk

## RE: HB 2352, HD1, Relating to the Hawai'i Teacher Standards Board

E ka Luna Hoʻomalu Kidani, ka Hope Luna Hoʻomalu Kahele, a me nā Lālā o ke Kōmike Hoʻonaʻauao o ka ʻAha Kenekoa, aloha! My name is Kaʻanoʻi Walk and I serve as the Senior Policy Analyst of the Kūamahi Community Education Division of Kamehameha Schools.

We are writing to **support** HB 2352, HD1, relating to the Hawai'i Teacher Standards Board, which increases the membership on the Hawai'i Teacher Standards Board to include a member of the Native Hawaiian Education Council and a non-voting public university student teacher. This measure will also clarify that a permit is required for non-licensed teachers serving in public schools.

We believe that the inclusion of a representative from the Native Hawaiian Education Council will help to provide increased Native Hawaiian education knowledge, perspective and acumen to the board. This is an important and highly inclusive step that will help inform discussion at the board level on past, current, and future Native Hawaiian education issues.
