Aloha Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Keith-Agaran and Members of the Committee,

On behalf of the Kapolei Chamber of Commerce, I am submitting this testimony in strong support of HB 2659 HD1 SD1. We would like to request your consideration of the following amendments:

1. The gross annual salary requirement should be comparable to a living wage in the City and County of Honolulu. This will align with the intent of this measure to create more professional, living wage jobs:

Page 3, (3) – Provides gross annual salaries of  $\frac{$44,000}{}$  or more to at least half of its employees at the establishment in the designated geographic area;

The living wage is the hourly rate that an individual must earn to support their family. This gross annual salary requirement of \$44,000 (\$21.15 /hr.) falls above the living wage (full-time employment) for the City and County of Honolulu for 1 adult:

Household Size	Hourly living wage
1 adult	\$16.03
1 adult, 1 child	\$28.11
1 adult, 2 children	\$30.37
1 adult, 3 children	\$40.40
2 adults (1 working)	\$24.36
2 adults (1 working) 1 child	\$29.74
2 adults (1 working), 2 children	\$32.97
2 adults (1 working), 3 children	\$40.13

The Area Median Income for the City and County of Honolulu for 1 adult is \$73,300 (\$35.24/hr.). If this threshold is used, many businesses may not qualify as there are living wage, professional jobs that will not qualify.

- 2. Reinstating a carry over of the tax credit in a loss year to p4, (2):
  - (d) If the tax credit under this section exceeds the taxpayer's net income tax liability, the excess of credit may be used as a tax credit against the taxpayer's net income tax liability in a subsequent taxable year; provided that no excess credit may be used after December 31, 2028.

Providing for a carryover of the tax credit, <u>small businesses</u> are given the assistance needed as it may take several years to show a profit. A small business often does not have the larger capital investment dollars that a larger corporation will have. By not having a carryover provision, favor for the larger businesses and corporations is given over the small business. Many of professional services who will enroll in this initiative (medical offices, family law offices, etc.) fall in line with a smaller business model.

The Kapolei Jobs Initiative Pilot Program's intent is to stimulate professional job growth to help keep pace with Kapolei's population growth. This Program realizes the State's long standing policy of redirecting growth to the second urban core. It will create more professional, living wage jobs in the Kapolei region and reduce traffic congestion.

Job creation in the Kapolei region is a quality-of-life, community-building concern affecting employers and employees alike.
