TESTIMONY FOR SENATE BILL 2046, RELATING TO FIREARMS

Honorable Chair Taniguchi and committee members:

I am Kris Coffield, representing IMUAlliance, a nonpartisan political advocacy organization that currently boasts over 400 members. On behalf of our members, we offer this testimony in strong support of Senate Bill 2046, relating to firearms.

On October 1, 2017, 64-year-old Stephen Paddock of Mesquite, Nevada opened fire on a crowd of concertgoers at the Route 91 Harvest music festival, leaving 58 people dead and 851 more injured. Paddock fired more than 1,100 rounds from his suite on the 32nd floor of the Mandalay Bay Hotel. Notably, 12 of the rifles found in the gunman’s room after the attack had been modified with “bump stocks,” an attachment that enables a semiautomatic rifle to fire faster.

Immediately after the attack, the National Rifle Association announced that it would support tighter restrictions on such modifications. A bump stock replaces a rifle’s standard stock—the part of a rifle held against the shoulder. Bump stocks enable semiautomatic guns to slide back and forth more rapidly, harnessing kickback energy generated upon firing. Essentially, the stock “bumps” back and forth between the shooter’s shoulder and trigger finger as the shooter holds his or her trigger finger in place, allowing the weapon to fire at nearly the rate of a machine gun.

As last week’s tragedy in Parkland, Florida shows us, we must take action to protect our citizens from gun madness. Mahalo for the opportunity to testify in support of this bill.

Good morning. My name is Melodie Aduja. I serve as Chair of the Oahu County ("OCC") Legislative Priorities Committee of the Democratic Party of Hawaii. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on Senate Bill No. **2046** relating to Firearms; Trigger Modification Devices; and Bump Stocks.

The OCC Legislative Priorities Committee is in favor of Senate Bill No. **2046** and supports its passage.

Senate Bill No.**2046** is in accord with the Platform of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i ("DPH"), 2016, as it prohibits trigger modification devices, including bump stocks, that are designed or function to accelerate the rate of fire of a semiautomatic firearm.

Specifically, the DPH Platform provides that "[w]e believe in a government that will adequately, efficiently, courteously, openly, ethically and fairly administer to the needs of the people." (Platform of the DPH, P. 5, Lines 245-246 (2016)).

We must protect our children, our future, from violence and neglect and provide them with a safe and healthy environment in which to grow and thrive. (Platform of the DPH, P. 4, Lines 186-187 (2016)). Educational facilities must be maintained, renovated and built to 21st century innovations so that our students learn in well-designed, safe environments. (Platform of the DPH, P. 6, Lines 300-302 (2016)).

Given that Senate Bill No.**2046** prohibits trigger modification devices, including bump stocks, that are designed or function to accelerate the rate of fire of a semiautomatic firearm, it is the position of the OCC Legislative Priorities Committee to support this measure.

The Injury Prevention Advisory Committee **supports SB2046** that would prohibit trigger modification devices, including bump stocks, that are designed to function to accelerate the rate of fire of a semiautomatic firearm.

Established in 1990, the Injury Prevention Advisory Committee (IPAC) is an advocacy group committed to preventing and reducing injuries in Hawai'i. IPAC members include representatives from public and private agencies, physicians and professionals working together to address the eight leading areas of injury, including violence prevention.

SB2046 would prohibit the conversion of a semiautomatic firearm to mimic an automatic firearm, which is an illegal in Hawaii. The mass shooting in Las Vegas is one example of the devastation wreaked by converted guns. Hawaii has one of the lowest firearm-related fatality rates in the nation because there are comprehensive firearm laws in place, including the law that prohibits automatic firearms.

We urge you to support SB2046 to help ensure the safety of Hawai'i residents and visitors.

This bill is too vague in description and scope. "Rate of fire" must be clearly defined. "Cyclical" or "sustained" are the technical terms for the "rate of fire" that do not appear in the SB2046. Both are intrinsic to the design and operation of any firearm.

"Trigger modification device" must be clearly defined. There are different trigger modification devices on the market which improve the safe operation of the firearm. There are trigger modification devices that apply to competitive marksmanship, military and law enforcement applications. These devices vary from firearm to firearm.

There will be the problem of identification of the devices. Will there be a trained gunsmith to identify and test each firearm? How will you prove that said device does increase the "rate of fire"?

Finally, there will be the enforcement problem. If you cannot stop drugs and aerial fireworks coming into the State of Hawaii, what makes you, as lawmakers, honestly think that this law will do anything?

The vague nature of the verbiage in SB 2046 stands to criminalize thousands of firearm owners in the State of Hawaii. SB 2046 targets "***any part, combination of parts, component, device, attachment, or accessory that is designed or functions to accelerate the rate of fire of a semiautomatic firearm***". Competition shooters and hunters will lose their investments and legally-obtained personal property in the form of common aftermarket triggers without compensation and without being convicted of committing any crime.

The broad and overreaching provisions of SB 2046 could criminalize firearm modifications such as competition triggers, muzzle brakes, and ergonomic changes that are commonly done by law-abiding gun owners to make their firearms more suitable for self-defense, competition, hunting, or even overcoming disability.

These restrictions will do nothing to curb violence or deter criminals from obtaining or using such devices, and only serve to automatically and arbitrarily make LAW ABIDING CITIZENS criminals overnight for no reason at all.

Removing law abiding citizens access to firearm accessories will do nothing to stop or deter criminals and their activities regarding weapons use. Instantly turning lawful citizens into felons because of owning certain property without due process, nor compensation, is in clear violation of the 4th, 5th, and 14th amendments to the Constitution of the United States.

-If you pass this bill, how will people to abide this law, without automatically turning into a felon and criminal, if they already own these items?

These items that are being legislated against already have been vetted and deemed legal and defined legal by the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms (ATF), according to firearms laws.

These devices are very expensive property and are considered legal. What kind of compensation will you give to persons who now have to somehow legally get rid of these devices? What is the procedure for surrendering LEGAL items, which this law is intended to summarily turn illegal, with no due process of law or trial, with the assumption that they are intended to be used in any crime?

The 4th Amendment states:

“The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.”

The 5th Amendment further protects property, by stating:

“No person shall be ... deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.”

The 14th amendment states:

"All persons born or naturalized in the United States and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. Anything that we can do to protect our citizens of the islands from them adding to already dangerous tools I support and hope you will too. We are not taking guns away from people just making sure that they are safer for all.

I am a Hawaii resident, currently enrolled, in the Pennsylvania Gunsmith School Master Gunsmith course, in Avalon, Pennsylvania. This course provides 2,500 hours of instruction in many aspects of the trade of the gunsmith. I am in my 3rd semester and will graduate in June. Prior to selecting this school as a requirement of the Veterans Administration for Vocational Rehabilitation Training, I surveyed a number of gun related businesses on Oahu. In my survey, I found none of the businesses in the firearms industry, on Oahu; had a gunsmith.

I ask that you reconsider the wording of S.B.2046 due to the fact that I strongly believe it is beyond the capabilities of Hawaii law enforcement and the state of the gunsmith industry in the State of Hawaii to be able to carry out its enforcement.

There are literally thousands of handguns and long rifles currently lawfully registered and held in private ownership in the state. Many of these handgun, shotguns, and long guns are used in competitive shooting matches on gun ranges within the state. Many of these guns have been modified to improve shooter performance. There is no formal database record kept of modifications performed on the thousands of firearms involved in these competitions nor in the thousands more in the hands of local citizens.

You cannot look at a handgun, shotgun, or long rifle; and tell from visible inspection that it has been modified in violation of the amendments proposed in S.B. 2046. You cannot measure trigger pull on a number of these guns and determine that it is not within the factory set specifications.

It takes a gunsmith or a person who is a certified armorer on that specific type of gun; with the correct tools to disassemble the gun and with the correctly calibrated instrument to measure the trigger pull. Even experienced gunsmiths are not aware of all the modifications in existence or ever produced for all guns. If you send a gun back to the manufacturer for repairs; if they can repair it, they will reinstall factory original parts and bring the gun back to original factory specifications. Whatever modifications were in the gun, will be removed.

I attended, as a student gunsmith, SHOTSHOW 2018, in Las Vegas, in January. There were over 1,800 vendors; the vast majority of which were not primary gun manufacturers. Those many many small displays booths were for the vendors who sold parts and accessories for guns.

Millions of guns are being produced and sold with OEM, and 3rd party parts installed and resold as new. There are no records or database of these 3rd party reseller sales; and other than the initial registration, as done here on Oahu with the Honolulu Police Department; who would know or know how to find out?

So at what point in the marketing channel is a modified gun considered illegal?

Who is going to perform an inspection on a "modified" firearm, presumed to be illegal?

I'd like to meet the law enforcement officers that can visually identify a gun that has been modified in violation of the proposed amendment. I'll tell you now, that they don't exist. Any gunsmith can install trigger sets that can fool anyone and still be legal.

Who are you going to get to check the gun for violations? I would charge \$125.00/hour with a minimum 1.5 hour to visually examine, enter book into FFL logbook, disassemble, examine, verify parts as OEM or a modification, reassemble, measure trigger pull, test fire(extra charge for ammo), clean bore/breech, prepare report, and log gun out of FFL logbook. If there is only 1 gunsmith on Oahu; I don't have a gun safes for long guns; and I'm sure the Honolulu Police Department can't stock a backlog of more than 1,000.

You may think you have gunsmiths on Oahu? Ask them how they got for their training as a gunsmith; not some certification on a gun or that they may have handled guns all their life. How many barrels have they threaded and set the headspace; and on what receivers?

There are a number of problems with SB2046.

1. It is unenforceable.
2. It does not address an existing problem.
3. It thus does not solve an existing problem.
4. It would do nothing to lower crime nor enhance public safety.
5. It criminalizes common actions by law-abiding citizens.
6. The parameters of illegal acts is preposterously overly broad.
7. The actual terminology of the proposed law is incorrect and the effect outlawed by the language can be achieved simply without violating any of the proposed illegalities.

1. The law is unenforceable. You'll recall that in 1992 the Hawaii state legislature passed and the governor signed and enacted into law a ban on standard capacity handgun magazines (the magazines originally manufactured for and intended for sale with the handguns) of greater than 10 rounds. After seven (7) years of enforcement of that law, in 1999, a criminal illegally used standard capacity magazines of greater than 10 rounds in a handgun to murder seven people during the infamous "Xerox murders". How could this person have had illegal magazines after seven years of enforcement? Simple. Because that law, like the proposed SB2046, couldn't be enforced. There is absolutely no way for government enforcement authorities to know if anyone possesses the banned materials (well, except it's

pretty clear most people own string and rubber bands, see point 7) or modifications. Do not pass another unenforceable law.

2. It does not address an existing problem. How many crimes have been committed in Hawaii using a bump stock, trigger crank, or firearm “modified to increase the rate of fire”? That's right: none. Perhaps the authorities will reveal some heretofore unknown cases, but a search of the public records as per news reporting indicates no such crimes have been committed. Do not pass a law that does not address an existing problem.

3. It thus does not solve an existing problem. If there is no problem to be solved, why pass a law? This is another case of lawmakers passing a “feel good” law, as if they are addressing and solving a problem where in reality none exists, i.e. “a solution in search of a problem”. Do not pass a law that would be of no use. Do not use the so-called “precautionary principle”, the concept that something may happen in the future, even though supporting evidence may be slim or none as in this case, so legislation needs to be created “just in case”. If you really want to enhance “public safety” based on actual proven danger to public safety, please look at the drowning statistics for the state of Hawaii and pass a law banning anyone from entering the ocean. That is something that would truly save lives. I wonder why you don't enact a ban on that behavior, one that would clearly save lives, unlike this proposed ban on something that will likely never happen, and if it does happen will only prove that the law is useless (i.e. a person/criminal intent on committing a crime using a firearm, which may include charges of assault, manslaughter or murder is hardly likely to be dissuaded/deterred from that criminal behavior because of the new added charge of possessing a bumpstock or other device that has accelerated the rate of fire of his weapon).

4. It would do nothing to lower crime nor enhance public safety. Since there is no problem that would be solved by any of the aspects of this law, there is absolutely no possible effect of lowering crime nor making the public any safer. Do not pass an ineffective law.

5. It criminalizes common actions by law-abiding citizens. Many firearms owners “modify” their firearms in order that they are enhanced for accuracy, “feel” (e.g. “smoother” trigger pull), longevity, appearance, etc. None of these aspects of modification has anything at all to do with criminality, unless and until a law such as SB2046 is enacted which criminalizes common actions by law-abiding citizens to no end other than citizens questioning why such a law would be proposed and enacted when it has no effect of reducing real crime.

6. The parameters of illegal acts is preposterously overly broad. Using the literal terms of the proposed bill something as simple as lubricating metal parts, much less polishing them would technically fall under the purview of the term “modification”. That's absurd, yet it wouldn't be the first time government has passed a law with vague and ambiguous language that can then be “interpreted” to mean whatever they want it to mean on a case by case basis. Do not pass a law with vague, ambiguous, and overly broad language, that can serve only to entrap otherwise law-abiding citizens for (previously) noncriminal behavior and where no one has been harmed.

7. The actual terminology of the proposed law is incorrect. Any of the devices or modifications outlawed in SB2046 do not “increase the rate of fire”. Such terminology would only apply to fully automatic firearms, which fire rounds continuously as long as the trigger is moved to the “fire” position, and can thus be tested with objectivity both before and after a modification (hold the trigger down before and after the “modification” and record the time to empty the same capacity magazine). Such weapons are already illegal in Hawaii. Such an objective test is not possible with a semi-automatic firearm, as are addressed by SB2046. What the modifications that are outlawed in SB2046

do is make an increased rate of fire “easier” for a trained operator to achieve. Making the modification alone is no guarantee of an increased rate of fire. Indeed, if all the members of this committee and the entire legislature were to go to the range and be given an “unmodified” semi-auto rifle and asked to fire the rifle until the, for example, 10 round magazine was empty via pulling the trigger, allowing the reset, and pulling the trigger repeatedly as fast as they could until all ten rounds were fired, and that time was recorded, then, “modify” that exact same rifle by installing a “bump stock” and ask the same legislators to now fire that rifle to the point of emptying that same 10 round magazine, I can virtually guarantee that the bump stock will not yield an “increased rate of fire”, but a DECREASED rate of fire. Why? Because a bump stock does not “increase the rate of fire”, it only makes an increased rate of fire possible (“easier”) by a person who has learned to use it for that purpose. And here is the problem: AN “INCREASED” RATE OF FIRE CAN BE ACHIEVED BY BUMP FIRING A FIREARM WITHOUT ANY MODIFICATIONS WHATSOEVER BY A PERSON WHO HAS TAKEN THE TIME TO LEARN TO BUMP FIRE. Such an “increased rate of fire” can also be made “easier” using string, rubber bands, a stick, a piece of metal, belt loops on pants, etc. Are you going to outlaw all those things, and nothing at all? You would have to outlaw firing at a particular rate of fire. Thus you see the absurdity of this law.

Please don't vote to pass an unenforceable, useless to crime reduction and public safety, and overly broad, vague, ambiguous, and technically incorrect language law that wouldn't prevent anyone who wants to achieve an “increased rate of fire” from achieving that without violating any of the provisions of the proposed law anyway.

Aloha Chair Taniguchi, Vice Chair Rhoads, and members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary,

On behalf of the nearly 600 registered members of the Young Progressives Demanding Action (YPDA) Hawai'i, I would like to express **strong support** for SB2046.

In the wake of Parkland, Umpqua, Santa Monica, Rancho Tehama, Marysville, Sandy Hook, Virginia Tech, Columbine and the now decades-long history of mass shootings at schools, I am angry, afraid and so tired of watching the news segments; of waking up to text alerts that more of my fellow millennials—and those even younger than us—will never grow up. And for what? Campaign donations exchanged for beneficial regulatory terms for arms manufacturers? The perpetuation of a gun culture that can be used to generate partisan points on a political score board? Defense of an archaic interpretation of the Second Amendment? Enough is enough.

Military-grade weapons have no place in society. They are unnecessary for self-defense, hunting or target practice. Bump stock triggers modify semi-automatic weapons to allow for up to 800 rounds fired a minute, mimicking fully automatic firearms—assault weapons. Popular among mass shooters, assault weapons pose a distinct threat to the safety and security of Hawai'i's people, and people all over the world. After the expiration of the federal ban on assault weapons in 2004 and the failure to renew it by Congress, it now falls upon the states to pass sensible laws to prohibit these deadly weapons and any trigger mods that emulate them.

I've watched the videos from the Parkland massacre. I've seen the charts that show just how many school shootings have taken place in America. Since 2000, there have been at least 188 shootings at schools and universities. It's hard to cite a definitive number, because the federal government does not study gun violence in the United States, despite recommendations from the Center for Disease Control that it do so; the National Rifle Association has opposed any measure to fund research or accounting of America's gun epidemic. But one statistic points out just how horrible our country's gun sickness is. Between 2000 and 2010, 57 incidents of mass shootings with two or more victims occurring on school

campuses were recorded in 36 different countries. Twenty-eight—half of all those incidents—took place in the United States.

Our children deserve to go to school free from the fear that they may never see their parents again; that any given school day might be their last on Earth. That is absolutely unacceptable. We need strict gun control regulations on assault weapons; on trigger modifications; on licensing, ammo, background checks, firearm training and carrying capacity. For the love of humanity, gun regulations should be *at least* as strict as regulations on driving an automobile.

Yesterday, just days after witnessing their friends brutally murdered before their eyes, the survivors of the Parkland massacre watched as their state legislature refused to even consider a proposed assault weapon ban. Those kids, and young people all across the country, will hold responsible any and all politicians that put the interests and money of the NRA and its supporters above the lives and futures of America's youth. And here in Hawaii, we will do the same. No more hiding behind the Second Amendment. We're done waiting for elected leaders to do the right thing. We demand gun reform now.

Dear Honorable Chairman Taniguchi the Representatives of the Judiciary Committee:

I believe this bill oversteps the bounds of reasonable gun control measures in several ways. I can certainly understand the concern (and fear of) a bump-fire device and the desire to do something after the Las Vegas shooting. However, this bill also covers a broad range of trigger groups/components often used by hunters, sporting marksmen, competitive shooters, as well as recreational marksmen. These triggers (manufactured by numerous companies) do little to increase the rate of fire of a semi-auto firearm and are primarily installed to improve accuracy by means of a smoother trigger pull & more consistent break than the stock trigger components. Additionally, these improved triggers are not only purchased aftermarket but are often preinstalled at the factory by the actual firearms manufacturer. So many local marksmen who own higher end firearms or shoot competitively will become felons overnight with no recourse or "grandfathering". Again I fully understand that many people want something done, but most of these people have no real knowledge of firearms, most have never shot a firearm for various reasons and probably don't grasp the difference between a bump-fire device/trigger crank and a competition or precision trigger group.

I have been a resident of our state my entire life, and have owned, shot, and competed with firearms since I've been legal to own one. I've gone through all the obstacles and speed bumps to legally own said firearms, even though my career actually includes the use of and thorough training with firearms. That's why I oppose this Senate Bill as it's written. It "bans" firearms already illegal in the state of Hawaii as well as addresses laws we already have in place. It also adds more restrictive laws that (as always) will not only affect legal, law abiding citizens but also local licensed firearms dealers and shops.

It's my belief that this Senate Bill, as it's currently written, will encounter a lot of opposition from local marksmen, businesses, and firearms related organizations. Good Afternoon,

My name is Shawn Hazelgrove. I own a company on the mainland that manufactures steel targets for outdoor shooting. This is our 3rd year in business. I have customers all across the United States, including military and law enforcement. I spend a lot of time shooting long range and interacting with customers at outdoor ranges. I currently live in Hawaii and would be impacted by this poorly worded and constructed bill. I have owned numerous firearms since before I could drive a car. I am qualified in the military on the M11 service pistol, the M500 shotgun, and the M4A1 carbine. I also hold a valid Florida concealed carry license and have completed both the Indiana and Florida hunter education classes. I was a member of the Florida Fraternal Order of Police Outdoor Range for 5 years prior to moving to Hawaii.

It appears to me that this bill is coming after bump stocks because of the Las Vegas murders. Notice I did not use the words "gun violence" or "mass shooting." It took a mentally deranged and ill person to carry out those terrible crimes. Remember, it takes a person behind the weapon to carry out a shooting. This mentally ill man would have found any way possible to carry out his plan even if bump stocks were outlawed.

Just so we can stick to the facts here, bump stocks do not modify a trigger. They go onto the butt stock of semi-automatic firearms. Semi-automatic firearms will only fire at the rate that the shooter is capable of pulling the trigger. Take a look at some of the world famous competition shooters that participate in cowboy action shooting with lever action rifles and revolvers. They can shoot faster and more precisely than most shooters with modern semi-automatics. It takes training and practice to get that good. I would encourage you to take a look at Jerry Miculek who has numerous world records with revolvers. I have personally observed shooters at the range who have end modifications and little training get outshot by those with simple firearms and lots of training.

This bill is far too vague. I would like to see the facts and statistics that you used in order to formulate this bill. How many deaths in Hawaii have resulted from bump stocks or aftermarket triggers? On your own facebook page you talk about not politicizing events like Las Vegas, yet that it is exactly what you have done. Will this bill ban common aftermarket triggers that target shooters commonly use that are manufactured

for semi-automatic firearms of all types? Companies such as Timney, Giessele, Zev, Bravo Company, Agency Arms and numerous others. What about going from a curved trigger to one with a flat face? What about changing out a 7 pound trigger spring to one that is 5 pounds? Or, a single stage factory trigger to a two stage competition trigger? None of these make a gun shoot faster. They increase the feedback and feel to the shooter. Remember, it takes a person's input every time on the trigger for each round. They do not change the way a gun fires. A lighter trigger pull can help with younger shooters or women who might anticipate the recoil and pull the gun off target. They are also better for long range shooters who use breathing techniques when hunting or practicing. Much like runners do not want to run in combat boots, those of us who shoot for fun or competition do not want a trigger that takes 12 pounds to pull back. The trigger is one of the most commonly modified items on a firearm because it is manipulated each time a round is fired. I am concerned about who will be the judge and expert on trigger modifications when it is very clear that politicians and those who support this bill have no knowledge or experience with firearms. Who will say what is legal and what is not? Will that be the police chief, the governor, the Attorney General? Or will it be up for discussion each time I try to register a new or used firearm? Will my Timney trigger that is 4 pounds be banned over my stock trigger that was 7 pounds? What about adjustable weight triggers?

There is a large market for firearms accessories. There will always be companies looking to skirt around the law and create a legal product, with concurrence from the ATF. Most of these products stem from already existing federal or state laws. Take a look what is happening in places like California and New York. Companies are creating new products to get around the recently passed laws. Technology will stay ahead of the law. They are trying to ban items based on appearance and how scary they look instead of keeping guns out of the hands of criminals and the mentally ill. Not to mention, hunters, target shooters and those who carry for self-defense and are legally allowed to own guns are the ones who are punished and forced to buy new products to get around these new laws.

It is actually fortunate that he used a bump fire stock because of how inaccurate they make a firearm. There is a reason that target shooters do not use them for precision shooting. Had the murderer actually taken the time to aim, he would have killed more people. He also had no formal training and was just spraying bullets, hitting many people with ricochets.

My point is this: quit trying to focus on the firearms and firearms parts and address the mental health issue in this country and state. The Las Vegas murderer killed himself when law enforcement arrived. The Newtown murderer did the same. As did the Columbine murderers. And the 1991 Killeen, TX murderer, the Virginia Tech murderer and the March 21, 2005 murderer in Red Lake, MN. April 3, 2009 In Binghamton, New York, Jiverly Wong killed 13 people and injured four during a shooting at an immigrant community center. He then kills himself. The majority of all of these mass murderers have several things in common. They rarely live because they kill themselves. They want to be in control until they realize someone has responded, so they take their own

life. They also have mental issues and sought treatment for them, such as the Virginia Tech student, the Sandy Hook murderer and Stephen Paddock in Las Vegas. They never should have had access to firearms to begin with. Most of them have little social contact and have strange tendencies such as wearing 20 pairs of socks in one day as Adam Lanza did. How about holding the US Air Force accountable for not putting the most recent Texas murderer into the correct databases for his violent domestic assaults? We have the tools and laws on the books to stop the next killer. It is time we enforce them and work on the mental health in the country. Mental health care is the most declining field of medicine since the 1960s, while the use of prescription medicines and outpatient mental health care has skyrocketed. Until we can have an educated discussion on the people behind the firearms, we will not solve a thing. Guns are not violent, and they do not pull the triggers on their own. People are violent, and it takes a person to pull a trigger. Or rent a Home Depot truck. Or make a pressure cooker bomb.

I oppose this bill and any others like it. Do not punish the law abiding citizens of this state. Open the dialogue and get a firearms expert to help out. You don't take your car to the veterinarian's office do you? Last week made a generous donation and choose to upgrade my NRA Endowment Life Membership to a Patron Life Membership because when I am at work providing for my family, the NRA will be fighting for me while politicians who think they know better legislate bills against me and the sport that I love. We will not go quietly.

The Senate has the decision to further the Bill SB2046 and digest the testimonies from those who oppose. I have taken the time to read all the testimonies that have been posted to date. For many who are opposed some of their reasoning is faulty. The gun activists will challenge the use of the term, "bump stock." They know exactly what is being discussed and will continue to insist that there isn't a definition for the term "bump stock."

Therefore, since that term is used in the bill SB2046. I offer what was proposed during the February 21, 2018 House Committee on Consumer Protection and Commerce regarding HB1908 Relating to Firearms.

On February 21, 2018 the House Committee on Consumer Protection and Commerce held a HB1908 Relating to Firearms was heard. Numerous testimonies were submitted. Several Oral testimonies were heard.

Bear in mind that I witnessed during the aforementioned meeting, those opposed presented testimony objecting to the "wording" of the bill stating there isn't a definition by the NRA or ATF regarding "Multiburst Trigger Activator, therefore there cannot be any enforcement. To further obtain support from one individual testifying, the committee offered the following to further define the term. Again, the person testifying wasn't supportive, and it was apparent that any definition would not satisfy him. Here is the California Penal Code definition and the same definition the CPC offered;

Multiburst trigger activator;

(a) A device designed or redesigned to be attached to a semiautomatic firearm, which allows the firearm to discharge 2 or more shots in a burst by activating the device.

(b) A manual or power-driven trigger activating device constructed and designed so that when attached to a semiautomatic firearm it increases the rate of fire of the firearm.

My point is that all public schools on Oahu are open campuses. There isn't enough security to ward off intruders. Even with armed security guards there is no guarantee that they will confront an active shooter. Depending on the weapon, an armed guard may not have a chance against an active shooter.

These news stories are our red flags. Some may say it's copycat because of the shootings in Florida. Well they were copycats for the ones previous. Leading back to Columbine when The United States of America could not foresee the future. Identified as a single incident, no real action was taken. Then the next and the next and here we are 2018.

Many "legal" gun owners do not want to be penalized or considered criminals because of current ownership of an altered firearm as described above. They need to get with time, stop being selfish.

The NRA's call to action and Gun enthusiasts have stuffed the ballots. Here are excerpts from some of their written testimony for NOT supporting this bill;

- Worn out triggers that need to be replaced
- Disability (lost part of my strength in my index finger due to surgery, I require modifications) or too heavy for me to pull **(Do something else)**

- Impossible to enforce **(that was said when Hawaii required seatbelts, "click it or ticket" is working)**
- Bump stocks can be replaced by a shoe lace, rubber band, a belt. **(Fine replace it.)**
- This bill is an arbitrary ban **(NO, this has been well televised and reported)**
- This is an ATF issue. **(No, this is a safety issue)**
- We are target shooter and hunters, it increases accuracy. **(Doesn't a scope do that, and as for target shooters and hunters, one shot should hit the bullseye)**
- Improves the function of a semi-automatic firearm. **(Not necessary, Don't care)**
- No past history in Hawaii of this, no existing problem **(WHY WAIT?)**
- Knee jerk reaction to something that happened in 2017
- Criminalizes common actions by law-abiding citizens **(Just turn them in)**
- Banning devices used for recreational, sporting and competition **(Find something else to do)**
- Wording is vague, too broad, too overreaching, citing the 2nd amendment, citing 5th amendment, its flawed, used for self-defense, "Feel good bill," it will do nothing to stop violence or reduce crime, seeks to solve a non-existent problem,

It's time to take action! Or set a limit on the firing rate of semi-automatic weapons.

** I offer further research:

California is the only state that explicitly restricts the sale of bump-fire devices, according to Freilich, the LCPGV attorney. The Golden State has the toughest gun laws in the country, and has banned bump-fire stocks since 1990, Freilich said. The statute bans "multiburst trigger activator," defined as a device attached to a semi-automatic rifle that "allows the firearm to discharge two or more shots in a burst by activating the device." I am writing in support of SB 2046, the bump stock ban.

On October 1, 2017, a gunman opened fire from a hotel room on the 32nd floor of the Mandalay Bay hotel into an audience of 22,000 at a country music festival in Las Vegas, killing 58 people and injuring more than 500. The gunman fired more than 1,100 rounds of ammunition in 11 minutes, using semi-automatic rifles modified with a dangerous firearm accessory designed to dramatically accelerate the rate of gunfire. These accessories, commonly known as “bump fire stocks,” enabled the worst mass shooting in modern U.S. history and turned a concert venue into a war zone.

Fully automatic firearms aka machine guns are banned under federal law. But in the last decade the gun industry began marketing devices intended to circumvent this federal law by allowing a gun owner to modify a semiautomatic rifle—which is currently legal to buy and possess under federal law—in such a manner that it operates with a similar rate of fire as a fully automatic rifle. A bump fire stock harnesses the recoil of a semiautomatic rifle to enable a shooter to fire shots much more quickly than if he or she were simply squeezing the trigger on a firearm not altered with a bump stock. **Equipped with a bump stock, the Las Vegas shooter was able to fire 90 shots in 10 seconds.** While often marketed as a novelty item for recreational shooters, bump stocks and similar devices that accelerate the rate of fire of a semiautomatic firearm are extremely dangerous and pose a substantial risk to public safety.

Since the massacre in Las Vegas, the price of bump stocks and similar devices has more than tripled, and a mad dash to purchase these deadly devices has ensued. Instead of taking responsible measures to ensure that these devices are never again used to commit a mass shooting, the gun industry is profiting off of mass tragedy. At the same time, the estimated financial cost of the shooting in Las Vegas is upwards of \$600 million, to say nothing of the human cost of this tragedy on the local community.

In the immediate aftermath of the shooting in Las Vegas, there was widespread agreement that bump stocks and similar devices should be banned: An October 2017 poll found that 82% of Americans support banning bump stocks. And yet the NRA, the Hawaii Rifle Association and other pro-gun lobbyists continue to loudly obfuscate the issue with unfounded arguments.

Because of the paralysis in Congress in Washington, we are counting on our state legislators to ban this instrument enabling mass slaughter of civilians.

Thank you for your support for this bill that will keep us all safer.

Regarding SB2046, relating to reducing trigger modifications for rifles, I strongly support passage of this bill.

However, in addition to prohibiting trigger modifications which accerlate the rate of fire, please consider that whether firing a so called assault rifle or a hunting rifle, anyone can pull the trigger just as fast.

30 round magazines can be added to most hunting rifles.

Please limit magazine size to six bullets.

Please add an extra latch to magazines which will complicate the reloading process, resulting in a slowed down reloading process. Otherwise, deft users can swap magazines in the blink of an eye. The goal is to slow down the rate of fire of a mass murderer.

So, limit magazine size, and, complicate the reloading process. Just by making the reloading process take 3 seconds, instead of half a second, a significant pause in the pause in the rate of fire will result, giving people more time to respond.

However, this alone is still weak, and far from the goal. Please regulate gun ownership as much as car ownership.

Require written and practicle exams.

Require liability insurance. Magazines without the 'slow down latch' will have a much higher rate. Magazines with the 'slow down latch' will have a lower rate of insurance. Proof of insurance is required at the point of sale for a magazine in Hawaii.

Whomsoever is listed as the registered owner of a weapon that is not reported as stolen will be held financially liable for whatever damages are caused by use of that weapon. This will encourage parents to lock their weapons up, or store them away from the home.

Personally state that yourselves as elected officials will no longer accept any donations from the NRA, and donate any that you have received to a program benefiting our K-12 students.

I am a retired employee of the State of Hawaii (and also a retired attorney formerly in private practice). I support and contribute regularly but in very modest amounts to the Brady Campaign and Brady Center to Prevent Gun Violence. I am testifying in **support** of Senate Bill No. 2046, Relating to Firearms.

I submit these comments in furtherance of securing the safety of all Hawaii residents from the high economic and emotional costs resulting from the ongoing epidemic of gun violence across the United States.

The danger posed by devices like "bump fire devices," or bump stocks, is real and serious and has been known for some time. Bump stocks are one of many accessories to firearms that increase their rate of fire and enable otherwise lawful weapons to be converted into the functional equivalent of fully automatic weapons or machine guns. On October 1, 2017, the nation saw how destructive these devices can be in Hawaii's "ninth island". Despite shooting from a quarter of a mile away, the Las Vegas gunman killed 58 people, injured several hundred more, and inflicted extensive emotional distress on thousands of men, women, and children.

Devices like bump stocks pose grave dangers to public safety and have no place in our communities. While we are blessed to live in a State with more common-sense gun regulation than most, the Legislature can and should do even more to address bump stocks and similar devices known as "trigger modification devices" through legislation such as S.B. 2046. Legislative action ensures maximum clarity -- to the public, the industry, and law enforcement -- regarding how these dangerous accessories fit into the broader scheme of gun-related policies. Decisive legislative action minimizes opportunities for obstacles and delay for those hoping to forestall corrective action and extract profit in the meantime. The Legislature needs to act now. Time is of the essence in preventing foreseeable future incidents and saving lives.

Finally, as your Committee receives input from the gun industry and gun enthusiasts on the potential impacts of any change in oversight and regulation of bump stocks and other similar devices, please also focus on the importance of public safety -- the lives and safety of men, women and children in Hawaii -- rather than only on the alleged expense and inconvenience to those who manufacture, import, sell, or use these dangerous accessories.

As a teacher of the community, I strongly support bill SB2046. Every single one of my students has been affected by the several threats surrounding DOE campuses as well as the tragedy at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School earlier this month. Countless amounts of studies show that states with stricter, common sense gun laws have lower per capita deaths by firearm. Hawaii as a state is low on the list of per capita deaths by firearm, however the US as an average surpasses numerous high income countries upon comparison. In 2010, the United States gun homicide rate was **over 25 times** the combined rate for twenty-two other high income countries. The gun homicide rate for children between the ages of 5-14 is **13 times the rate** of twenty-five other high income countries.

Bump stocks simulate the ability of a fully automatic weapon. In 1986 Congress banned the future production of machine guns for civilian use. The NFA (National Firearms Act) regulates a number of weapons and mandates registration and taxation. Under the NFA, EVERY sale is regulated and covered by its provisions, not just sales by licensed dealers. Background checks are not constrained to a time limit and can take as long as necessary, whereas under the Brady Act, if a background check isn't completed within 3 days, the law allows the seller to complete the transaction. Unfortunately, due to the "gun show loophole" approximately 30-40% of gun sales are through private dealers, requiring no background checks whatsoever. As of 2016 however, the Brady Act has helped to stop the sale of 2 million prohibited users from buying guns from licensed dealers.

Statistics show that machine gun crime is negligible after years of strong laws; the ATF has studied crime gun trace data and finds that only 3 in every 1000 crime guns are machine guns. It is clear that due to the strict regulations placed on machine guns that fall under the NFA, use of those weapons in crime related activities is close to zero.

Why anyone would need to simulate an automatic weapon that can increase the rate of fire from 45-60 rounds per minute to 400-800 rounds per minute in today's society makes little to no sense at all. Data has shown and continues to show that when stronger gun regulations are put in place, less people needlessly die by gunfire. Please pass SB2046.

SB2046 is too broad and will have unintended consequences. SB2046 could criminalize firearm modifications such as competition triggers, muzzle brakes, and ergonomic changes that are commonly done by law-abiding gun owners to make their firearms more suitable for self-defense, competition, hunting, or even overcoming disability.

Bump stocks are used by lawful gun owners at ranges. Bump stocks allow the user to operate a firearm without the need for a finger to be on the trigger. Most triggers require the application of several pounds of force to actuate the firing mechanism. Some people cannot produce this much force with their fingers, but can with other parts of the body. Bump stocks have the advantage of enabling participation in shooting sports to people who have weak hands and fingers, such as women, the elderly, and the disabled.

Disabled people already have limited activities, not being able to engage in many sports that require strength, speed, and agility. Please do not restrict the weak and disabled further by making bump stocks illegal.

A bump stock is to hand disfunction as a wheelchair is to leg disfunction. No one would propose a rule that would do away with wheelchairs. Similarly, bump stocks should be legal to use. Punish bad behavior of people who abuse them and shoot others for reasons other than self defense. Please do not punish everyone who uses them.

The right of self defense should be available to everyone by whatever means that enables it. This right is not only for the men, the able bodied, and the young. A bump stock may be the only way that a woman, an elderly person, or a disabled person can use a firearm for self defense. Self-defense alternatives, such as knives, pepper spray, and baseball bats require the attacker to be at close range to the victim. Keep in mind that hand-to-hand combat is not an option for most women, the elderly, and the disabled, and could lead to the death of the victim. Thus, the rule against bump stocks would unfairly discriminate against women, the elderly and the disabled. It especially discriminates against old and disabled women.

Making bump stocks illegal would be like making trucks illegal after a terrorist runs a truck through a crowd, killing many people. Most truck drivers are not terrorists. Making bump stocks illegal would be like making knives illegal after a criminal uses a knife in a gang fight. Most knife owners are not gang criminals.

A single incident of a terrorist misusing a device is no excuse to infringe on the rights of everyone else who owns a similar device. Most bump-stock owners are not terrorists. Making bump stocks illegal will not punish the terrorist who misused it. It will, however, punish other people who are not responsible for that or any other crime. It is always wrong to punish the many for the sins of the few.

A bump stock is not a firearm but only an accessory device. It would be a dangerous precedent for Hawai'i to regulate accessories. It constitutes a slippery slope that would lead to future serious infringements on our constitutional rights.

Laws and regulations should focus on human behavior, not on physical objects. Laws and rules should make crimes out of behaviors that actually harm people or animals, thus resulting in victims. Owning and using a bump stock should not be illegal. Who is the victim if a gun owner also has a bump stock? Most gun owners are not criminals and intend to harm no one.

Murder and felonious assault are already illegal. We do not need more laws and rules against victimless "crimes." Law-enforcement personnel already are busy enough catching real criminals who actually attack people. It would be a misapplication of scarce police resources and waste of time for police to hunt and arrest bump-stock owners while violent criminals terrorize our communities.

Making bump stocks illegal would be a violation of the second amendment, which requires the government to refrain from infringing on our God-given right to keep and bear arms. The fact that many other infringements have occurred in the past is not a sufficient excuse to continue the infringement in the future.

For all of the reasons discussed above, I urge you to vote NO on SB2046. Keep bump stocks and other accessory devices legal.


