In an effort to generate alternative sources of revenue to address each county's budgetary challenges, the counties urge the Hawaii Legislature to support this bill. Providing the counties with such taxing mechanism would allow the counties to be less dependent on revenue sources such as fuel tax revenue which is predicted to decline with the increase in electric, hybrid, and other fuel efficient vehicles.

This was one of the three priority measures that was discussed with the joint House and Senate finance committees at the beginning of this session.
