Senate Bill 2331, Senate Draft 1 proposes to appropriate funds to Nā Ala Hele, the Hawaii Statewide Trail and Access Program, by improving access to and maintaining state controlled recreational trails statewide and promoting hiker safety and hiker etiquette education and outreach. **The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this measure, provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in the Executive Supplemental Budget request.**

The Department's Division of Forestry and Wildlife has a current statewide inventory of 128 trail-and-road features spanning approximately 855 miles. These trails and access routes have experienced record numbers of users. Increased use has led to trail degradation, trail-head conflicts with residents, and an increase in mountain rescues.

The proposed \$1.8 million appropriation would be applied to improving access to and maintaining state controlled recreation trails statewide, including planning, trail design, construction, and rehabilitation, as well as promoting public education and outreach relating to hiker safety and etiquette. Many of the current challenges associated with trails are due to heavy use, exacerbated by social media, drawing attention to formerly little-known trails. When these trails and their trailhead areas are located in residential areas, conflicts can arise due to parking, early morning visitors, and infringement on private property. Moreover, some trail users are unaware or unprepared for the specific trail conditions of the area they are visiting. Education is needed to help alleviate trailhead congestion and conflicts, improve safety for trail users, and minimize impacts to rescue personnel by making sure hikers are better prepared for backcountry

travel. The Department remains in strong support of this measure and recognizes the benefits to residents, visitors, first responders, and the overall sustainability of our trails.

On behalf of our 20,000 members and supporters, the Sierra Club of Hawai'i **supports SB 2331 SD 1**, which makes an appropriation of \$1.8M to improve Na Ala Hele, the Hawai'i statewide trail and access program, by improving access to and maintaining state controlled recreational trails statewide and promoting hiker safety and hiker etiquette education and outreach. This appropriation is critical to ensure that the 128 trail and roadway features that Na Ala Hele manages can be adequately maintained to protect our environment, ensure public safety, and keep up with increasing recreational use.

The Sierra Club has utilized Hawai'i's parks and trails to educate students, visitors, and concerned residents on the importance of environmentalism, as well as demonstrate the beauty of Hawai'i's unique natural spaces. In 2017, our organization led over 200 hikes statewide and worked to maintain dozens of public and private trails. The O'ahu Group alone led nearly 90 hikes and service projects, with an emphasis on native species conservation, hiker safety, and trail etiquette.

We know firsthand that our state's trail systems are in dire need of maintenance and protection. Millions of residents and visitors use these trails everyday, but the funds to protect them have declined significantly every year. SB 2331 SD 1 seeks to correct this by allocating funds to the Na Ala Hele program. In order to continue enjoying the hiking trails within our beautiful state, we must prioritize trail funding. The Sierra Club of Hawai'i strongly urges the committee to pass SB 2331 SD 1.

We are writing to you from a community of 250 households, approx. 600 residents, that has painfully experienced firsthand the ongoing impacts of a poorly funded DLNR Na Ala Hele trail system. The health and safety of our families and kupuna and trail users are impacted daily by a trail that has no management and no resources.

Today hikers invade our residential neighborhood waking up residents at 5:30am. Elder residents have trouble navigating around hikers to get to their homes as this trail has no parking and no security. Property is destroyed and daily trash is left for residents to clean up.



With no enforcement, resources and controls, the safety of our Keiki are impacted daily. Children can't play in their own front lawns as hikers speed around looking for parking. Criminals prey on hiker cars and police spend much time ticketing cars that are blocking



driveways and hydrants.

Years of neglect has left the Aina destroyed. Hikers regularly need rescuing often by helicopter at great public expense. There is no trail enforcement and maintenance.



Our precious Aina, waterways and marshes are being destroyed due to gross overuse, no maintenance and few resources. Thousands of hikers are polluting our environment, this is shameful.



Hawai'i has long been noted for its natural beauty and clean environment. As stewards, much more needs to be done today to better manage and protect our finite resources. We need good accountability and clear sustainability plans. There are already several Japanese websites that talk about the filth and destroyed land at these overused trails.
