In consideration of SENATE BILL 2561 RELATING TO THE HAWAII ASSOCIATION OF CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

Senate Bill 2561 proposes to appropriate \$450,000 of general revenues in Fiscal Year 2018-2019 for operating expenses and staffing costs of the Hawaii Association of Conservation Districts (HACD). The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this bill provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in our Executive Supplemental Budget request.

The purpose of the Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) Program is to educate, construct, maintain, and assist in the development of conservation plans to protect soil and water resources. Each SWCD is operated by a five-member volunteer board. HACD is an umbrella organization formed by the 16 SWCDs under Chapters 180 and 180C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and administratively attached to the Department. The Department notes that the SWCD Program does not have a base budget appropriation and funding would be required for the continuance of their activities.

Public/Private Partnership for FY2017

- Federal (cash and in kind): \$520K State: \$332K County: \$500K
- SWCD board members and volunteers donate in excess of 17,500 hours annually.
 - Multiply this out by a nominal \$25/hr consulting rate and this adds \$437.5k to the value of the partnerships;
- State funding (332K) then becomes a modest investment, leveraging every volunteered hour, State, County and Federal dollar to over \$1.789 million of agricultural based services.


