Good morning, my name is Melodie Aduja. I serve as Chair of the Oahu County Committee ("OCC") Legislative Priorities Committee of the Democratic Party of Hawaii. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on **SB3001 SD2**, relating to Alternate Energy Research and Development Pilot Program and an appropriation.

The OCC Legislative Priorities Committee is in favor of **SB3001 SD2**, and support its passage.

**SB3001 SD2** is in accord with the Platform of the Democratic Party of ), 2016, as it establishes an Alternative Energy Research and Development Pilot Program and appropriates moneys for grants under the pilot program, and repeals the pilot program on 6/30/2020.

Specifically, the DPH Platform states that "[w]e seek to achieve energy sustainability based on renewable energy sources. We must encourage the use of clean alternative fuel sources to include our public transportation systems. We must increase the use of public transit, telecommuting, car and vanpooling, ridesharing, biking, walking, and other forms of transportation thereby reducing traffic congestion and air pollution. We must also urgently develop the use of a variety of cost-effective energy providing systems, encourage transit-oriented development, and support tax incentives that encourage renewable energy initiatives.

We oppose any tax breaks to fossil fuel industries.

We support energy independence, self-sufficiency, affordability and reliability for Hawai'i through the development of renewable alternative energy sources.

Specifically, we need to support policies that foster the development of energy production methods that de-emphasize carbon based fuels and promote renewable sources such as wind, solar, wave, geothermal and Ocean Thermal Energy Conversion (OTEC).

Electricity rates in Hawaii are among the highest in the nation despite the fact that we enjoy an abundance of sunshine year round. Electric utility companies and cooperatives must open the grid to alternative power sources including solar panels and geothermal energy. We support the effort of our government officials to require utilities to provide for the maximum, comprehensive, integrated use of renewable energy and associated technologies such as storage and smart grid technologies." (Platform of the DPH, PP.8-9, Lines 443-462 (2016)).

Given that **SB3001 SD2** establishes an Alternative Energy Research and Development Pilot Program and appropriates moneys for grants under the pilot program, and repeals the pilot program on 6/30/2020, it is the position of the OCC Legislative Priorities Committee to support this measure.

Makai is a locally-owned and operated technology company based in Hawai'i for over 44 years. A driving reason for Makai's existence is to help Hawai'i achieve energy independence using clean, alternative and renewable resources. Hawai'i is blessed with abundant natural resources such as wind, solar, geothermal, hydro, biofuels, and ocean energy. While wind and especially solar contributions to the energy portfolio are now commercial and have grown significantly, other options like ocean energy have the potential to massively contribute to the supply of base load / firm / constant renewable power, but are worryingly underrepresented.

Makai is currently performing R&D and working towards commercialization of ocean thermal energy conversion (OTEC) and at the Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawai`i Authority (NELHA) in Kailua-Kona. Makai employs eight highly-paid, highly-skilled engineers and scientists in the high tech / renewable energy field in rural Kailua-Kona. This program has achieved a huge milestone of connecting to the grid, making Hawai`i the home of the world's largest operational OTEC plant, and the clear leader in the emerging market of ocean thermal energy. Plans are in the works to move this technology even further ahead.

These technologies are at the same maturity level that solar and wind was 20 years ago, and

Governor David Ige was present to dedicate the power plant and 'flip the switch,' and in his keynote address he said, "One big difference with OTEC is that it is a firm power source; it

allows us to generate electricity consistently... and in the evening hours when other renewable sources are not available, which really is the key to a 100% renewable future."

With the help of programs like this bill, Makai has been able to secure additional competitively awarded federal funding from the U.S. Navy, and bring home national honors, such as the Small Business Administration's Tibbetts Award, recognizing success in commercializing federal R&D, which ultimately increases taxable revenue for the state.
