Purpose of Resolution:

### **Department's Position:**

The Department of Education (Department) supports the intent of SCR 92, yet respectfully requests to address specific concerns in the proposal.

The Department has made every effort to wisely spend all federal funding provided. As such, clarification of the statement about the underutilization of \$175,000,000 of federal funding per vear is incorrect. The United States Department of Education (USDOE) has provided the Department an amendment called Tydings which allows the Department to expend these federal funds over a 27-month period of time to appropriately spend the federal funding. The Department utilizes these funds through the Tydings waiver to fully expend over 27 months.

The Department also makes every effort to fully expend all appropriated federal funds, which are provided by Congress as supplemental funds for our needlest students, and does not usually lapse any federal funding.

Education is a key investment in the state's economic development and an investment in its local employee base capacity for all Hawaii industries. The Department respectfully suggests that all federal funds are expended appropriately to support an equitable high quality instructional system, and as such, the proposed resolution is not necessary.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on this measure.

The Hawaii State Department of Education seeks to advance the goals of the Strategic Plan which is focused on student success, staff success, and successful systems of support. 
