The purpose for funds request is to hire a full-time Museum Director/CEO, and rental space for archives storage and larger office space for the year 2019-2020. In 2018, the Institute for Museum & Library Science awarded the organization \$132,000 for 3-year period for partial salary for Museum Director/CEO and part-time data manager for the purpose of building organization capacity. To continue progress, a full-time Director is needed to meet the critical need of the Obama museum for the next three years and improve the delivery of services to educate youth (K12) and foster partnerships among local cultural heritage centers to address challenges facing the invisibility of the Africana community. Our primary commitment is to establish a venue to honor the 44th U.S. President birthplace and early childhood years. A place for youth to learn and be inspired to become future leaders implementing democratic principles. The Obama Museum fills a cultural heritage gap that is not embraced by the hegemony society.

The Obama Hawaiian Africana Museum was founded under the auspices of the African American Diversity Cultural Center in 1997. Through the years, scholars and researchers have uncovered archival documents related to the Africana experience in Hawaii State Hawaii Archives and Bishop Museum Repository archives dating back 200 years.

The Obama Hawaiian Africana museum operates exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the requirements of the Internal Revenue Service Section 501(C)(3) determination. The museum's repository consists of historical documents collected from the above archives some of which have been buried for two centuries. The documents are now being displayed and preserved to educate youth about the contributions of the Hawaiian Africana history.

Mission Statement

To perpetuate, preserve, & promote the history about Hawaiian Africana settlers, their descendants & contemporaries to educate young and old.


Vision Statement

To honor the birthplace and early childhood years of the 44th U.S. President Obama to empower K12 students & share its amalgamation of ethnic cultural diversity experiences with island people and visitor.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request

The goals and objectives for this request of \$500,000 is to acquire a small facility for the museum to honor the 44th U.S. President Obama birthplace & early childhood legacy as well as the untold stories about the early Africana settlers and their contributions from the days of King Kamehameha

3. The public purpose and need to be served



The public purpose and need to be served: First, the Obama Hawaiian Africana Museum facility will be a people centered preservation project to honor the 44th U.S. President's birthplace and his childhood legacy, and to educate and stimulate youth (K12) capacity for wonder, to go wherever their dreams take them. Barack Obama attended kindergarten at Noelani Elementary School in Manoa and graduated from Punahou. The museum's "Vision for the Future" is to empower youth to become effective leaders promoting democratic ideals and principles. Importantly, this project will nurture an equitable, healthy, resilient, vibrant, and sustainable community to broaden the intellectual conversation and engage

people in Hawaii and from around the world.

This project's work is grounded in recognition of the human aspiration needs for a powerful, and practical force to sustain, improve, and enrich people's lives to create a peaceful and harmonious environment for dialog.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

The target population: Youth (K12), general public (local residents 1.3 million population) and tourists.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

Over the past 20 years, the museum has served more than 125,000 school students throughout the islands, engaging them at school assemblies, classroom activities for kindergarten to 6th grades, in middle and high school classrooms, sharing Hawaii's diverse cultural history, community activities (50,000) via public exhibits, lectures across the State, including military bases, and all campus of private and public universities on all islands.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

Deloris Guttman, President & Volunteer Museum Director, with the Board Executive Committee, will oversee, manage, and coordinate this entire project.

- a. June 2019 May 2020. First Phase: To acquire funding to acquire a facility for the Obama Hawaiian Africana Museum. There are several facilities being considered depending on negotiation with owners.
- During the interim (January to March 2019), the board of directors will seek commitments from private foundations to match GIA Capital Funding from the Legislators.
- c. In 2020 Second Phase: the board of directors will hire fundraising consultant to launch a Capital Campaign Drive to raise an estimated \$15 million to retrofit and repurpose the facility to meet museum best practice.
- d. In 2021 Third Phase: Retrofitting the building, acquiring and install fixtures, purchasing equipment and furniture, hiring staff, and establish an Endowment.
- 2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

Timeline: Upon Acquisition of a facility, the Project will run from June 2020 to December 2024.

- The Museum's Director *Deloris Guttman with the Board Executive*Committee ensures adherence to the budget, quality assurance, and project accountability. During the initial stages the Board Executive Committee will oversee all aspects of acquiring a facility with the Obama Museum Legal team and report to the full board of directors at its monthly meetings.

From inception to completion, records will be kept on file to review.

The Obama Hawaiian Africana Museum dba African American Diversity Cultural Center Hawaii (AADCCH) for the past three years has implemented the Hawaiian Africana Youth Enrichment Program (HAYEP) in-school cultural studies curriculum at Moanalua Middle, James Campbell High and Radford High Schools serving over 1,000 students in classrooms. Additionally, the organization volunteers have dedicated more than 67,240 hours of services working with youth activities in and out of school empowering adolescent to strive toward success and be proud of their cultural identity. The museum's exhibits at Honolulu Hale Municipal Gallery has honored the late Senator Daniel K. Inouve for his contributions to Civil Rights during his tenure as a Congressional leader; Military recognition display showcased the participation and contributions of African Americans, Native Hawaiians, Native Americans, and Filipinos in WWII Pacific Theater. This past year, the exhibit was about Barack Obama's early childhood years leading up to his election as the 44th U.S. President. The guest book comments were from guests around the world. In 2017, the Honolulu City Council awarded the museum with \$75,000 to hire a full-time program specialist for the HAYEP in-school program. In 2018, the Institute for Museum & Library Science awarded the organization \$150,000 for partial compensation to hire a full-time Museum Director/CEO over three year period. This is a snapshot of the community services provided by volunteers for the past twenty years in operation.

Presently, the Obama Hawaiian Africana Museum occupies approximately 900 square feet of office and archival storage space in the Hawaii National Bank Building at 1311 Kapiolani Boulevard, Suites 203 & 207.

The funds requested are for acquiring a facility to provide space for the museum's collections & artifacts inventory, space for gallery exhibit, mini-theater for films and storytelling, class/conference rooms, space for administrative offices, mini-coffee boutique & gift shop, work room, and storage room to meet basic practice standards after retrofitting facility for museum occupancy.


