REPORT ON THE NUMBER OF PEN REGISTER ORDERS AND ORDERS FOR TRAP AND TRACE DEVICES APPLIED FOR BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES OF THE STATE

Pursuant to Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes

January 1, 2018 - December 31, 2018

Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that, "The attorney general, at least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, shall annually report to the legislature on the number of pen register orders and orders for trap and trace devices applied for by law enforcement agencies of the State."

From January 1, 2018, to December 31, 2018, there were eleven (11) pen register orders and orders for trap and trace devices applied for. Nine (9) of those orders were sought by County of Maui law enforcement. Two (2) orders were sought by County of Hawai'i law enforcement.
