A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 **PART I**

2 SECTION 1. There are appropriated from the sources of
3 funding indicated below to health premium payments (BUF 761) the
4 following sums or so much thereof as may be necessary to fund
5 for fiscal biennium 2019-2021, the Hawaii employer-union health
6 benefits trust fund costs in the agreement negotiated with the
7 exclusive representative of collective bargaining unit (7):

13 shall be paid wholly or proportionately, as the case may be,
14 from the respective funds.

15 SECTION 22. Funds appropriated or authorized by this Act
16 that are not expended or encumbered by June 30, 2020, and June
17 30, 2021, of the respective fiscal years, shall lapse as of
18 those dates.

19 SECTION 23. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.




