A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding two new sections to part XVIII to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§321-A Enhanced and expanded emergency medical services;
5	fees. (a) The department shall establish reasonable fees to be
6	collected from individuals who are:
7	(1) Transported by emergency ground ambulance services to
8	a health care facility designated by the department
9	for the care of the individual; or
10	(2) Provided health care by emergency medical services
11	personnel but not transported by ground ambulance to a
12	health care facility.
13	(b) The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
14	necessary to effectuate the purposes of this section.
15	(c) No later than July 1, 2020, the department shall adopt
16	interim rules, which shall be exempt from chapter 91 and chapter
17	201M, to effectuate the purposes of this section; provided that
18	the interim rules shall remain in effect until July 1, 2023, or

7	purposes of this section; provided that the interim rules shall
8	remain in effect until July 1, 2023, or until rules are adopted
9	pursuant to subsection (e), whichever occurs sooner."
10	SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
12	designated and to read as follows:
13	"§346- Coverage of ground ambulance services. Beginning
14	on January 1, 2020, the State's medicaid programs:
15	(1) May provide coverage for ground ambulance services
16	pursuant to part XVIII of chapter 321; and
17	(2) May provide coverage for health care provided by
18	emergency medical services personnel, pursuant to part
19	XVIII of chapter 321;

3	Services."		
4	SECTION 3. The department of health shall submit a report		
5	of its find	ings and recommendations, including any proposed	
6	legislation	, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior	
7	to the conv	ening of the regular session of 2020, 2021, 2022, and	
8	2023. The	report shall include:	
9	(1) T	he status of any rules adopted pursuant to this Act;	
10	(2) A	report on community stakeholders engaged in	
11	đ	eveloping the community paramedicine program;	
12	(3) T	he progress of the establishment of reasonable fees	
13	f	or individuals who are transported to health care	
14	f	acilities via ground ambulance or provided with	
15	h	ealth care by emergency services personnel but are	
16	n	ot transported; and	
17	(4) R	ecommendations as to a private insurance mandate for	
18	c	overage of ground ambulance services.
