A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM INCENTIVES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that consumption of fresh
- 2 fruits and vegetables is an integral part of a healthy diet and
- 3 central to the prevention of obesity and chronic disease. The
- 4 legislature also finds that every community should have access
- 5 to fresh and healthy dietary options, but the high cost of fresh
- 6 produce often makes that difficult. This challenge is felt
- 7 acutely by participants in the federal supplemental nutrition
- 8 assistance program, a low-income population that struggles to
- 9 afford healthy food.
- 10 The legislature further finds that through the national
- 11 double up food bucks program, Hawaii has the opportunity to
- 12 expand access to healthy foods for low-income residents who are
- 13 eligible for supplemental nutrition assistance program benefits.
- 14 Currently implemented in more than twenty states, the double up
- 15 food bucks program provides matching federal grant moneys to
- 16 state programs that incentivize the use of supplemental
- 17 nutrition assistance program benefits for the purchase of fresh

- 1 produce. Provided by both the United States Department of
- 2 Agriculture National Institute of Food and the United States
- 3 Department of Agriculture's food insecurity nutrition incentive
- 4 grant program, these federal matching funds increase access to
- 5 healthy dietary options while also invigorating local economies
- 6 and addressing food insecurity.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 8 agriculture to develop and administer a Hawaii healthy food
- 9 incentive program promoting the purchase of Hawaii-grown fruits
- 10 and vegetables by beneficiaries of the supplemental nutrition
- 11 assistance program.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
- 14 designated and to read as follows:
- 15 "\$141- Hawaii healthy food incentive program; rules.
- 16 (a) There is established a Hawaii healthy food incentive
- 17 program for beneficiaries of the supplemental nutrition
- 18 assistance program, to be developed and administered by the
- 19 department of agriculture.
- 20 (b) Participants in the Hawaii healthy food incentive
- 21 program who are beneficiaries of the supplemental nutrition

- 1 assistance program shall receive a dollar-for-dollar match of up
- 2 to \$10 per visit, per day, to be used exclusively for the
- 3 purchase of Hawaii-grown fresh fruits and vegetables at a
- 4 farmers' market, farm stand, mobile market, community-supported
- 5 agriculture site, grocery store, or other direct food retailer
- 6 that participates in the supplemental nutrition assistance
- 7 program.
- 8 (c) The department of agriculture may consult and
- 9 cooperate with private organizations to develop and implement
- 10 rules to administer the Hawaii healthy food incentive program.
- (d) For the purposes of this section, "farmers' market"
- 12 shall have the same meaning as in section 205-2(d)(15)(D)."
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 16 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 17 2020-2021 for administration of the Hawaii healthy food
- 18 incentive program and to provide matching funds to beneficiaries
- 19 who participate in the supplemental nutrition assistance
- 20 program.

- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- of agriculture for the purposes of this Act. 2
- SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored. 3
- SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019. 4
