A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOME CARE AGENCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that home care agencies
- 2 provide an important service to independent but elderly or
- 3 vulnerable persons by providing home-based non-health care
- 4 services that enable those persons to remain in their homes,
- 5 rather than be admitted into costly residential care homes or
- 6 institutional care facilities. The legislature further finds
- 7 that in order to safeguard the health, safety, and welfare of
- 8 those persons, the current licensure requirements for home care
- 9 agencies by the department of health should be retained.
- 10 Existing licensure requirements include background checks on
- 11 home care operators and workers and provide minimum standards on
- 12 the provision of home care services.
- 13 The legislature finds that Act 21, Special Session Laws of
- 14 Hawaii 2009, codified as section 321-14.8, Hawaii Revised
- 15 Statutes, requires that "each home care agency shall be licensed
- 16 by the department of health to ensure the health, safety, and
- 17 welfare of clients." The legislature notes that this statutory

- 1 licensure requirement for home care agencies is set to be
- 2 repealed on June 30, 2019.
- 3 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to permanently
- 4 require home care agencies in Hawaii to be licensed by the
- 5 department of health.
- 6 SECTION 2. Act 21, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, as
- 7 amended by Act 125, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, section 2, is
- 8 amended by amending section 8 to read as follows:
- 9 "SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009[7
- 10 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2019; provided that sections
- 11 321-11 and 321-11.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the
- 12 definition of "healthcare facility" in section 321 15.2, Hawaii
- 13 Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which they
- 14 read on June 30, 2009]."
- 15 SECTION 3. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to
- 16 diminish or abrogate the requirements to obtain or maintain a
- 17 home care agency license or certification.
- 18 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2019.
