A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EXEMPTIONS FROM REGISTRATION FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 249-31.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as 3 follows: 4 "[+]\$249-31.5[+] Exemptions [+]from registration fees[+] 5 for certain vehicles; disabled veterans. (a) A disabled 6 veteran who: 7 Is a resident of Hawaii; (1) 8 (2) Has been other than dishonorably discharged from the 9 United States uniformed armed forces; and 10 (3) Is determined by the United States Department of 11 Veterans Affairs or its predecessor to have a service-12 connected one hundred per cent disability rating for 13 compensation or a service-connected disability rating 14 of one hundred per cent[; and 15 Is in receipt of disability retirement pay from any 16 branch of the uniformed armed forces],

- shall be exempt from payment of all annual vehicle registration
- fees as required by section 249-31[. This]; provided that this
- 3 exemption shall not extend to [vehicles] any vehicle used for
- commercial purposes[, nor] or to more than one vehicle owned by 4
- 5 the disabled veteran."
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 7 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- begun before its effective date. 8
- 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
