A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISINTERMENT OF HUMAN BODIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 338-25.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) No corpse, nor the remains of any dead human body,
4	exclusive of ashes, shall be exposed, disturbed, or removed from
5	its place of burial, nor shall the receptacle, container, or
6	coffin holding the remains or corpse be opened, removed, or
7	disturbed after due interment, except upon written application
8	made to the director of health for a permit therefor and upon
9	the issuance and according to the terms of a permit granted
10	therefor by the director. After any removal or disturbance the
11	grave shall be filled at once and restored to its former
12	condition. A cemetery authority with a current and active
13	license with the department of commerce and consumer affairs may
14	disinter and reinter a corpse or remains within that same
15	cemetery without filing an application for a permit from the
16	department of health if the cemetery authority has written
17	authorization from the majority of the next-of-kin of the person
18	whose corpse or remains is disinterred, as determined by the

- priority of succession order required by section 531B-4; 1
- 2 provided that this exception shall not apply to disinterment of
- 3 a corpse or remains for transfer off of the cemetery property to
- another physical address. The cemetery authority may require a 4
- licensed embalmer to be available during the disinterment in the 5
- 6 event that human remains may be exposed.
- 7 For the purposes of this subsection, "cemetery," "cemetery
- authority, " and "cemetery property" have the same meaning as 8
- 9 provided in section 441-1."
- SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored. 10
- SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019. 11
