# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 356D-92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 Except as otherwise provided, the authority may "(a) 4 terminate any lease, rental agreement, permit, or license covering the use and occupation of any dwelling unit or other 5 6 premises located within a public housing project and evict from any premises any tenant, licensee, or other occupant for any of 7 8 the following reasons: (1) Failure to pay rent when due; 9 Violation of any of the provisions of a lease, rental 10 (2) 11 agreement, permit, or license; 12 Violation of any of the rules of the authority; (3) Failure to maintain the dwelling unit in a clean, 13 (4)14 sanitary, and habitable condition; 15 Upon a third violation of section 356D-6.5; provided (5) that a violation of any of these terms by a 16 17 nonresident, a quest who is visiting a resident, or by

4		the tenancy for an act that:
