ACT 252 H.B. NO. 808 H.D. 1 S.D. 2 C.D. 1

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SHARK AND RAY PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 188-39.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 4 hailepo; lupe; prohibitions, penalties, and fines. (a) [No]
- 5 Except as provided in subsection (e), no person shall knowingly
- 6 capture [or kill], take, possess, abuse, or entangle a [manta]
- 7 ray, whether alive or dead, or kill any ray, within state marine
- 8 waters.
- 9 (b) Any person violating this section or any rule adopted
- 10 pursuant to this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and
- 11 shall be fined:
- 12 (1) \$500 for a first offense;
- 13 (2) \$2,000 for a second offense; and
- (3) \$10,000 for a third or subsequent offense.
- (c) In addition to any other penalty imposed under this
- 16 section, a person violating this section shall be subject to:

1 (1) An administrative fine of not more than \$10,000 for		
2		each [manta] ray captured, taken, possessed, abused,
3		or entangled, whether alive or dead, or killed in
4		violation of this section;
5	(2)	Seizure and forfeiture of any captured [manta] rays,
6		commercial marine license, vessel, and fishing
7		equipment; and
8	(3)	Assessment of administrative fees and $costs[\tau]$ and
9		attorney's fees and costs.
10	(d)	The criminal penalties and administrative fines and
11	costs shall be assessed per [manta] ray captured, taken,	
12	possessed, abused, or entangled, whether alive or dead, or	
13	killed in violation of this section.	
14	(e)	This section shall not [prohibit] apply to special
15	activity permits allowed under section 187A-6[+] or research	
16	permits authorized by law; provided that the permit issued does	
17	not allow a take that exceeds the potential biological removal	
18	level; and provided further that the department shall adopt	
19	rules pursuant to chapter 91 to define a "take" and determine	
20	when a take exceeds the potential biological removal level.	

- 1 (f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to restrict
- the exercise of traditional and customary rights protected 2
- pursuant to article XII, section 7, of the state constitution. 3
- (g) For the purposes of this section, "ray" means any 4
- species of ray within the subclass elasmobranchii." 5
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 7 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 8 begun before its effective date.
- 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
