A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE BOATING FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 200-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the board
- 4 may lease any existing state boating facility in its entirety,
- 5 and fast lands and submerged lands within [an] any existing
- 6 state boating facility, by public auction, a request for
- 7 proposals, or by direct negotiation pursuant to section 171-59
- 8 and chapter 190D, for private development, management, and
- 9 operation; provided that [any lease of fast lands or submerged
- 10 lands pursuant to a request for proposals shall be subject to
- 11 section 200-2.6, regardless to which state boating facility the
- 12 fast or submerged lands are attached.] prior authorization from
- 13 the legislature shall be required for a lease pursuant to this
- 14 subsection.
- 15 As used in this section, the term "state boating facility"
- 16 means a state small boat harbor, launching ramp, offshore

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1	mooring,	pier, wharf, landing, or any other area under the
2	jurisdiction of the department pursuant to this chapter."	
3	SECTION 2. Section 200-2.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
4	repealed.	
5	["[\$200-2.6] Ala Wai boat harbor; leases. The fast lands	
6	and submerged lands of the Ala Wai boat harbor that may be	
7	leased include the following:	
8	(1)	All fast lands and submerged lands described in the
9		request for qualifications or request for proposals
10		issued by the division of boating and ocean recreation
11		of the department on November 25, 2008;
12	(2)	The fast land described as a portion of tax map key:
13		(1) 2-3-37-12, composed of approximately 112,580
14		square feet, presently used for harbor offices and
15		permitted vehicular parking; and
16	(3)	The fast land described as a portion of tax map key:
17		(1) 2-3-37-12, which is a triangular area located
18		Diamond Head of Mole B, presently used for permitted
19		vehicular parking."]

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- 1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
