

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MARINE LIFE CONSERVATION DISTRICTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes Molokini shoal as an
- 2 area worthy of special designation and treatment due to its
- 3 environmental and scenic importance. Molokini shoal has been
- 4 designated as a marine life conservation district, which are
- 5 designed to conserve and replenish marine reserves. Marine life
- 6 conservation districts allow only limited uses and provide a
- 7 protected area for aquatic life. Marine life conservation
- 8 districts are most popularly used for snorkeling, diving, and
- 9 underwater photography.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to preserve Molokini shoal by
- 11 limiting entry into the Molokini marine life conservation
- 12 district to forty-one permits and twenty permitted vessels at
- 13 any given time.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 190-4.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "§190-4.5 Anchoring, boating, and mooring in marine life
- 17 conservation districts; rules. (a) The department shall,

- 1 pursuant to chapter 91, adopt rules for the regulation of
- 2 anchoring and mooring in each marine life conservation district
- 3 established under this chapter.
- 4 (b) There shall be no more than forty-one permits and
- 5 twenty permitted vessels granted entry into the Molokini marine
- 6 life conservation district at any given time.
- 7 (c) Within its jurisdiction over ocean recreational
- 8 boating and coastal activities, the department shall adopt rules
- 9 pursuant to chapter 91 for the regulation of boating in each
- 10 marine life conservation district established under this
- 11 chapter."
- 12 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
