A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that improving our

2 schools begins by setting a goal and having a vision. The

3 department of education strategic plan sets goals to increase

4 student engagement, student empowerment, and support for its

5 employees. Often a vision can stem from observations of best

6 practices adopted in other states. Examples of best practices

7 include operations that emphasize peer-to-peer learning and

8 teacher-personnel engagement.

9 The legislature further finds that Massachusetts is making

10 notable advances in education, as evidenced by its

11 internationally competitive assessment results, educational

12 practices, and student learning outcomes. Massachusetts

13 established a collaborative planning and expanded learning time

14 initiative geared toward better supporting the growth of its

15 teachers and students. The Massachusetts public school system

16 is similar to the public school system in Hawaii.

1	The	purpose of this Act is to establish a working group to
2	consider	and develop best practices for collaboration planning
3	and expan	ded learning time in Hawaii's public schools.
4	SECT	ION 2. (a) There is established a working group
5	within the department of education for administrative purposes	
6	to consid	er and develop best practices for collaborative
7	planning	and expanded learning time in public schools.
8	(b)	The working group shall consider the following:
9	(1)	Individual teacher preparation time to allow teachers
10		to adequately prepare for instruction the following
11		day;
12	(2)	Collaborative teacher preparation time to allow
13		opportunities for like-grade teachers to facilitate
14		conversation amongst each other regarding effective
15		pedagogy in the classrooms to create high-quality
16		lesson plans;
17	(3)	Teachers to, at the start of each school day or prior
18		to the conclusion of each school day, work with
19		students who are struggling with any lesson taught
20		earlier that day or the preceding day; and
21	(4)	Any other issue the working group may deem necessary.

(4) Any other issue the working group may deem necessary.

2	members:	
3	(1)	Chair of the house of representatives committee on
4		lower and higher education, or the chair's designee,
5	e e	to serve as co-chair;
6	(2)	Chair of the senate committee on education, or the
7		chair's designee, to serve as co-chair;
8	(3)	The superintendent of education, or the
9		superintendent's designee;
10	(4)	A department of education principal;
11	(5)	A department of education teacher;
12	(6)	A representative from the Hawaii State Teachers
13		Association;
14	(7)	A representative from the Hawaii Government Employees
15		Association; and
16	(8)	Other members as the group may deem necessary.
17	(d)	The department of education shall be responsible for
18	the admin	istrative responsibilities of the working group,
19	including	but not limited to the posting of public notices,
20	agendas,	minutes, organizing meetings, and reporting on the
21	outcome a	nd recommendations of the working group.

1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
