A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that increased community 2 input is valuable and necessary in helping to reshape public
- 3 education in Hawaii. The legislature further finds that in
- 4 order for public school complex areas to truly take the lead in
- 5 delivering educational outcomes that are most effective for
- 6 their communities, more autonomy from the central offices of the
- 7 department of education is required.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to grant the board of education
- 9 the authority to appoint complex area superintendents for
- 10 schools.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 302A-604, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "§302A-604 Complex area superintendents. The
- 14 [superintendent of education, with the approval of the] board[7]
- 15 shall appoint complex area superintendents for schools. The
- 16 complex area superintendents shall supervise the delivery of

1	administrative	and	instructional	support	services	within	their

- 2 respective complex areas, including:
- 3 (1) Personnel, fiscal, and facilities support;
- 4 (2) Monitoring of compliance with applicable state and
- 5 federal laws;
- 6 (3) Curriculum development, student assessment, and staff
- 7 development services; and
- 8 (4) Special education programs and special schools within
- 9 the complex area."
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
