A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's existing

2 laws do not adequately address the reporting of lost or stolen

3 firearms. As a matter of public safety, the State requires the

4 permitting of firearms owners and the registration of firearms

5 to ensure that firearms remain in the possession of individuals

6 who are properly vetted and meet the stringent requirements to

7 own or possess firearms. Law enforcement officers must have

8 knowledge and an accurate record of lost or stolen firearms to

9 protect the public.

10 Access to accurate information in the national and local

11 databases for lost or stolen firearm enhances police officer

12 safety in situations involving firearm ownership and possession

13 issues. The information allows police officers to timely

14 investigate and seize lost and stolen weapons quickly and

15 surely.

- The purpose of this Act is to strengthen the system of 2 firearm reporting in the State by requiring firearm owners to report lost, stolen, or destroyed firearms. 3 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 6 and to read as follows: 7 "§134- Reporting lost, stolen, or destroyed firearms; 8 penalties. (a) Every person shall report the loss, theft, or 9 destruction of a firearm that the person owns or possesses **10** within twenty-four hours upon the discovery of such loss, theft, 11 or destruction to: (1) The police department of the county within which the 12 **13** person resides; and 14 The police department of the county where the theft, (2) loss, or destruction occurred. 15

If a person is unable to comply with this subsection, the

13	report th	e loss, theft, or destruction of any firearm pursuant
14	to this s	ection shall:
15	(1)	For the first offense, be guilty of a petty
16		misdemeanor;
17	(2)	For the second and each subsequent offense, be guilty
18		of a misdemeanor; and
19	(3)	For the third and each subsequent offense:
20		(A) Surrender all firearm registrations, ammunition,
21		and firearms to the police department for the

2	seven days of receiving a notice of violation of

4	(B) Be prohibited from registering, possessing, or				
5	owning a firearm.				
6	(e) If a person fails to surrender all firearm				
7	registrations, ammunition, and firearms as required in				
8	subsection (d), the chief of police of the county within which				
9	the person resides or within which any of the person's firearm				
10	registrations, ammunitions, or firearms are present shall seize				
11	all firearm registrations, firearm ammunition, and firearms				
12	registered to and in possession of the person.				
13	(f) For the purposes of this section, an incident				
14	involving multiple firearms arising in the same occurrence shall				
15	constitute a single offense.				
16	(g) No person shall report to any law enforcement agency				
17	that a firearm has been lost, stolen, or destroyed knowing the				
18	report to be false. If a person falsely reports a lost, stolen,				
19	or destroyed firearm, the person shall be in violation of this				
20	section and subject to the same penalties as provided in				
21	subsection (d).

2	the failu	re to report is the result of:
3	(1)	An act of God or act of war;
4	(2)	The inability of a law enforcement agency to receive
5		the report; or
6	(3)	The person who is required to report being
7		hospitalized, unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise
8		seriously physically or mentally impaired as to
9		prevent the person from reporting."
10	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
11	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
12	begun bef	ore its effective date.
13	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
