### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROPERTY FORFEITURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

#### Report Title:

Attorney General; Penal Code; Forfeiture; Civil Assets

#### Description:

Prohibits civil asset forfeiture unless the covered offense is a felony for which the property owner has been convicted. Excludes the forfeiture proceedings for an animal pending criminal charges. Requires the Attorney General to distribute one half of all forfeited property and the sale proceeds thereof to the Hawaii law enforcement assisted diversion program, with the remaining half to be distributed to the state general fund. (HB748 HD2)
