12	(b) Knowii	ngly makes a false statement in written, printed,	
13	elect	ronic, or oral form, to a state investigator or a

16	any co	ounty ordinance, rule, or regulation;

14	"State investigator" means a person employed, contracted,		
15	or appointed by the State or a state department or agency to

18	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that		
19	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
20	begun before its effective date.
