HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REPORT ITS CURRENT USAGE AND PLANS FOR FUTURE USAGE OF GLYPHOSATE AND GLYPHOSATE-CONTAINING HERBICIDES ON AND AROUND DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION PROPERTIES, INCLUDING SCHOOLS AND PLAYGROUNDS.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, glyphosate, a general use pesticide, is one of the most common chemicals used for functional and aesthetic landscaping purposes throughout the State; and
5 6 7 8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, the World Health Organization's International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) evaluated the carginogenic risks of glyphosate, and IARC Monograph 112, published in 2017, classified glyphosate as probably carcinogenic to humans, stating that there is limited evidence in humans for the carcinogenicity of glyphosate, and a positive association has been observed for non-Hodgkin lymphoma; and
12 13 14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, IARC Monograph 112 further stated that there is sufficient evidence of the carcinogenicity of glyphosate in experimental animals to conclude that a causal relationship has been established between exposure to the agent and human cancer; and
18 19 20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, in 2017, the State of California added glyphosate to a list of chemicals recognized as carcinogens in the California Labor Code and under California's Proposition 65, also known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986; and
25 26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, in 2018, a California trial court upheld an award of \$78.5 million in damages to a school groundskeeper after a jury determined he contracted non-Hodgkin lymphoma through his repeated exposure to the glyphosate-containing herbicides he applied throughout the school district; and



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1 WHEREAS, at least sixty-one cities, counties, and 2 communities across twenty-two states have moved to voluntarily 3 halt or restrict the usage of glyphosate, developed integrated 4 pest management policies restricting pesticide use, or banned 5 the use of glyphosate on public lands due to the possible 6 environmental and human health risks; and 7

8 WHEREAS, the State's commitment to the health and safety of 9 schoolchildren is expressed in its passage of Act 45, Session 10 Laws of Hawaii 2018, which prohibits the use of restricted use 11 pesticides on or within one hundred feet of a school property 12 during normal school hours; and

WHEREAS, based on currently available facts and 14 15 information, and as a precautionary measure to better understand whether the policy concerning the use of glyphosate on or near 16 17 school grounds is warranted, further information is needed on the current usage and applications and any existing departmental 18 policies regarding the purchase, use, handling, and storage of 19 glyphosate and glyphosate-containing herbicides within school 20 21 properties; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Education is requested to report its current usage, and plans for future usage, of glyphosate and glyphosate-containing herbicides on and around Department of Education properties, including school grounds and playgrounds; and

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report detail the purchase, usage, application, handling, and storage of glyphosate and 32 33 glyphosate-containing herbicides, including the volumes of 34 glyphosate and glyphosate-containing herbicides purchased on an 35 annual basis; amounts of glyphosate and glyphosate-containing herbicides administered on and around Department of Education 36 37 properties by Department employees on an annual basis; timetables of application, including frequency of application 38 and allowable days of the week and times of day for application; 39 and training requirements imposed on Department employees prior 40 to application to ensure correct use; and 41



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education report any existing departmental policies, and any plans to phase out the use of glyphosate or glyphosate-containing herbicides on Department properties, including phase-out timetables, and potential or actual replacement herbicides; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to submit its report containing its findings to the

9 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
10 the Regular Session of 2020; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 13 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 14 Education and the Assistant Superintendent of the Office of 15 School Facilities and Support Services.
