1 2 3	WHEREAS, artificial intelligence is on track to be one of history's most impactful scientific advances; and
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, artificial intelligence is intelligence demonstrated by machine, wherein machines mimic human cognitive functions like learning and problem solving; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, the benefits of artificial intelligence currently outweigh its costs; and
11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, advances in science are being used to benefit fields as diverse as trucking, medical diagnosis, and finance; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, however, many experts warn of the dangers associated with artificial intelligence, such as autonomous weapons, social manipulation, and invasion of personal privacy; and
19 20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, the United States and other global nations should examine the best ways to integrate and approach artificial intelligence to leverage its advantages and prepare against potential harm; and
24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, due to its central Pacific location and close proximity to Asia, Hawaii is an ideal place to host a global summit on artificial intelligence; now, therefore,
29 30 31 32 33	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is requested to convene a global artificial intelligence summit to be held in 2020; and


