HOUSE RESOLUTION

CONVENING THE MULTIPLE LANGUAGES EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION WORKING GROUP.

WHEREAS, as one of the most culturally diverse states in 1 the nation, Hawaii has one of the highest proportions of non-2 English speakers in the United States; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, about one in four Hawaii residents speak a language other than English at home, and about one in eight 6 Hawaii residents speak English "less than very well", giving 7 8 Hawaii one of the highest rates of persons with limited English proficiency, per capita, in the United States; and 9 10 WHEREAS, a significant percentage of visitors to Hawaii 11 have a primary language other than English; and 12 13 WHEREAS, residents and visitors who lack proficiency in 14 English are at great risk in emergency situations in which they 15 are unable to understand written or verbal warnings or 16 notifications, including warnings or notifications about 17 dangerous conditions, impending severe weather, and appropriate 18 emergency responses; and 19 20 WHEREAS, preparing for and responding to emergencies is 21 especially important, but sometimes very difficult, for 22 residents and visitors of limited English proficiency; and 23 24 WHEREAS, residents of and visitors to Hawaii with limited 25 English proficiency have expressed concerns regarding access to 26 27 and comprehension of emergency notifications; and 28 29 WHEREAS, bridging the communication gap is essential to ensuring equal access for all community members, especially in 30 emergency situations; and 31

WHEREAS, providing language access in disaster and 1 emergency management is critical to ensure that all of the 2 3 State's residents and visitors, regardless of English 4 proficiency, can access essential resources like shelters, 5 medicine, social services, and other disaster relief; and 6 7 WHEREAS, effective and appropriate communication that 8 reaches all who may be impacted by a disaster or emergency event is critical to protecting lives, families, and communities; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency coordinates emergency notifications and response to disasters; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency's planning 15 should include a means for residents and visitors of limited English proficiency to receive important emergency 16 notifications; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the convening of a working group of stakeholders 19 is a significant step toward sharing information, developing 20 ideas, and taking action to ensure meaningful access for 21 22 Hawaii's residents and visitors with limited English proficiency through the provision of emergency notifications in multiple 23 languages; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 26 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 27 28 2019, that a Multiple Languages Emergency Notification Working Group be convened to develop a plan to provide emergency 29 30 notifications in multiple languages; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Multiple Languages 33 Emergency Notification Working Group is requested to develop a 34 plan to provide emergency notifications in multiple languages for people with limited English proficiency, including: 35 36 37 Determining the scope of implementing emergency (1) notifications in multiple languages, including the 38 specific languages needed and the method or methods by 39 which the notifications should be provided; 40

1 (2) Developing a process to ensure that emergency 2 notifications in languages other than English are accurate, culturally appropriate, meaningful, and 3 timely; and 4 é 5 Identifying any necessary resources to effectuate the 6 (3) purpose of this measure, such as the cost of services, 7 necessary information technology software, or foreign 8 9 language translators who can provide timely translation services during disasters; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Multiple Languages 12 Emergency Notification Working Group is requested to comprise 13 the following members or their designees: 14 15 16 (1)Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, or the Director's designee, who shall serve as chair of 17 18 the working group; 19 (2) Director of Health; 20 21 (3) Director of Human Services; 22 23 24 (4)Chairperson of the Board of Education; 25 Director of Business, Economic Development, and 26 (5) 27 Tourism; 28 Chair of the University of Hawaii Board of Regents; 29 (6) 30 (7) Executive Director of the Office of Language Access; 31 32 (8) Executive Director of the Disability and Communication 33 Access Board; 34 35 Program Director of the Office on Equality and Access 36 (9) to the Courts; 37 38 Emergency Management Officer of the Maui Civil Defense (10)39 Agency; 40

2 Agency; 3 Director of Emergency Management of the City and (12)4 County of Honolulu; and 5 6 Administrator of the Kauai Civil Defense Agency; and 7 (13) 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chair of the working group invite representatives from the Hawaii Lodging and Tourism 10 11 Association, Hawai'i State Council on Developmental Disabilities, and the Inter-Agency Council for Refugee and Immigrant Services 12 to serve as members; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Multiple Languages Emergency Notification Working Group is requested to submit to the 16 17 Legislature a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no later than twenty days 18 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2020; and 19 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency; Director of Health; Director of 23 Human Services; Chairperson of the Board of Education; Director 24 of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Chair of the 25 University of Hawaii Board of Regents; Executive Director of the 26 Office of Language Access; Executive Director of the Disability 27 and Communication Access Board; Program Director of the Office 28 on Equality and Access to the Courts; Emergency Management 29 30 Officer of the Maui Civil Defense Agency; Deputy Director of the County of Hawaii Civil Defense Agency; Director of Emergency 31 Management of the City and County of Honolulu; Administrator of 32 33 the Kauai Civil Defense Agency; President and Chief Executive 34 Officer of the Hawaii Lodging and Tourism Association; Chairperson of the Hawai'i State Council on Developmental 35 Disabilities; and Chairperson of the Inter-Agency Council for 36 37 Refugee and Immigrant Services.
