## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CONDUCT A  
FEASIBILITY STUDY ON UNIVERSAL PILOT BADGES FOR AIRPORTS IN  
THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, there are approximately fifteen commercial,  
2 passenger, and general use airports in the State of Hawaii; and  
3

4 WHEREAS, many of these airports require pilots to hold  
5 separate badges, specific to each airport, to enter the  
6 premises; and  
7

8 WHEREAS, the process of obtaining and renewing multiple  
9 badges is time consuming and expensive, requiring several  
10 background checks and annual fees; and  
11

12 WHEREAS, a universal state airport badge would be more  
13 economical and efficient for pilots, thus facilitating easier  
14 intrastate travel; now, therefore,


16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
17 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of  
18 2019, that the Department of Transportation is requested to  
19 conduct a study on the feasibility and potential costs and fees  
20 for universal pilot badges for airports in the State; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of  
23 Transportation is requested to submit a report of its findings  
24 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the  
25 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of  
26 the Regular Session of 2020; and
