

HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO INCLUDE MENTAL HEALTH EDUCATION FOR STUDENTS IN ITS CURRICULUM AND SUICIDE PREVENTION AS PART OF THE IN-SERVICE TRAINING OF TEACHERS AND PRINCIPALS.

WHEREAS, suicide is the third leading cause of death among young people ages ten to nineteen; and

WHEREAS, protecting the health and well-being of students is in line with school mandates and an ethical imperative for all professionals working with youth; and

WHEREAS, predicting a crisis is impossible and every school needs to be prepared; and

WHEREAS, on average, one young person dies by suicide every two hours in the United States; and

WHEREAS, for every young person who dies by suicide, an estimated one hundred to two hundred youth make suicide attempts; and

WHEREAS, school staff play a pivotal role in recognizing and referring the student to treatment that may reduce risk; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, that the Department of Education is requested to require each secondary public school to establish as a condition for graduation, completion of a health education course that:

(1) Instructs students on the multiple dimensions of health, including the relationship between physical health and mental health; and

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Enhances understanding, improves attitudes, and (2) encourages behaviors that promote good health, wellbeing, and human dignity; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to require that the annual in-service training for teachers and principals include at least two hours of suicide prevention education and allow the training to be accomplished through self-review of suicide prevention materials approved by the Department; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of Education and Superintendent of Education.

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
