HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON WHETHER THE DENTAL AND MEDICAL SERVICES OFFERED BY THE STATE ARE ADEQUATE TO PROVIDE A BASIC STANDARD OF CARE FOR RESIDENTS WITH DISABILITIES.

WHEREAS, some of Hawaii's residents with disabilities 1 depend on the State for social services, including 2 3 transportation, dental care, and medical care; and 4 WHEREAS, the State may offer these services directly or 5 through various forms of insurance; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the level and nature of the services the State 8 provides depend on many factors, including the type and severity 9 of the individual's disability; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, many individuals with disabilities receive monetary stipends such as Supplemental Security Income (SSI), 13 which is provided to individuals who were never able to work, or 14 Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), which is provided 15 to individuals who have worked but are unable to continue due to 16 17 disability; and 18 19 WHEREAS, some individuals with disabilities have sought treatment in the State's emergency rooms because they lacked 20 access to or funding for routine dental or medical care; now, 21 22 therefore, 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 24 Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 25 2019, that the Department of Health and Department of Human 26 27 Services are requested to conduct a study to determine whether the dental and medical services offered by the State, either 28 29 directly or through various forms of insurance, are adequate to

provide a basic standard of care for residents with 1 disabilities; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health and 4 Department of Human Services are requested to submit a joint 5 report of their findings and recommendations, including any 6 proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty 7 8 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2020; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests Hawaii's congressional delegation to review whether the monetary 11 12 stipends granted for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) should be increased; 13 and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 16 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, Director of 17 18 Human Services, and Hawaii's congressional delegation. 19 20 21 OFFERED BY:
